The book ISI BALI 60 also recounts that the strategic efforts to strengthen a commitment to dedicated performance has, in fact, been undertaken collectively since this institution was named the Indonesian Academy of Dance (ASTI) Denpasar. We have made

various efforts to produce ISI BALI graduates who are resilient, grounded in Pancasila values, dynamic, critical, creative, and innovative in the fields of creation, research, education, and entrepreneurship in the arts, design, and culture. These efforts align with our commitment to realizing the slogan Global-Bali Arts and Creativity Centre Hub (G-BACCH), which has been enthusiastically celebrated over the past four years. The realization of the vision to become the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Bali (ISI BALI) has been carried out progressively, comprehensively, and extensively by establishing Astha Mahacitta Pabali (the Eight Pillars for embodying and actualizing ISI BALI's Noble Vision) since 2021. More than the name of country, "Bali" is conceptually inscribed as the fundamental framework and directional orientation; the internalization of spirit and space, along with the externalization of academic aspirations that envision the future (momenta). "Bali" is also understood as the wholeness of values that are revered and devoted to harmony with space, time, and universality. This foundation forms the conceptual basis of Astha Mahacitta Pabali, which consists of: (1) Bali Citta Swabudaya; (2) Bali Widya Kahuripan; (3) Bali Citta Pradesa; (4) Bali Citta Samasta; (5) Bali Sangga Dwipantara; (6) Bali Padma Bhuwana; (7) Bali Nata Bhuwana; and (8) Bali Citta Bhuwana. Each pillar upholds and channels Bali in all ideas, practices, and forms of the latest creative innovations.

1. Bali Citta Swabudaya

B ali Citta Swabudaya (BCS) is a community service platform that is contextual, relevant, thematic, and strategic at ISI BALI. The implementation of the BCS program produces concrete practical activities that emphasize objective potential, active community participation, exploring the uniqueness and strengths of villages, and delivering meaningful benefits. Some of the outputs of BCS include: Sastra Desa (exploring the values and artifacts of village civilization); Kawikon Kawiwiku (the social arts practices and works of village maestros); Murdha Natta (creation of village mascot dances); Sasmitha Desa (village ethnographic documentaries); Sawen Sastra Desa (village monographs); and Swabudaya Patra (inscriptions of Bali Citta Swabudaya).

The vision of BCS aspires to position village cultures as the fundamental pillars of Indonesian culture as well as a sustainable laboratory for research and creation. BCS actualizes the ideology of *gotong-royong* (mutual cooperation) in advancing Indonesian culture. Village cultures—with all its values, spirit, and socio-religious order—becomes the soul of the nation's future.

In 2022, BCS was implemented in five villages: Penglipuran Village (Bangli Regency), Tenganan Village (Karangasem Regency), Naga Sepaha Village (Buleleng Regency), Gadungan Village (Tabanan Regency), and Batuan Village (Gianyar Regency). In 2023, BCS was carried out in Tirtasari Village (Buleleng Regency) and Batur Kintamani Village (Bangli Regency). In 2024, it took place in Paksebali Village (Klungkung Regency) and Pupuan Tegallalang Village (Gianyar Regency).

BCS in Penglipuran Village, Bangli Regency, produced the following outcomes: (1) A monograph under *Sastra Desa* titled *Desa Swabudaya Penglipuran: Swagina-Karaman-Rupasampanna*; (2) An ethnographic documentary video under *Sasmitha Desa*; (3) A reconstruction of rare traditional arts under *Dharma Adhilango*; (4) Innovative product design under *Swagina Adhikara*; (5) A painting workshop under *Dharma Aguron-guron*; (6) The creation of a documentary film under *Dharma Sewaka Lelangon*.

BCS in Tenganan Village, Karangasem Regency, produced the following outcomes: (1) A monograph under *Sastra Desa* titled *Desa Swabudaya Tenganan Pegringsingan: Parigi-Gringsing-Slonding*; (2) Documentation of ritual potentials and cultural works under *Kawikon Kawiwiku*; (3) The creation of a dance especially for the village titled *Murdha Nata Dahayuning Gringsing*; (4) An ethnographic documentary film under *Sasmitha Desa*; (5) Logo design under *Swagina Adhikara*.




3. Bali Citta Pradesa

ali Citta Pradesa is a community service platform in the form of *ngayah*—volunteerism in traditional villages (*Desa Adat*) and sacred sites (*Parhyangan Jagat*). This service activity carries the spirit of *ngayah*—sincere, unconditional dedication through performing arts such as dance and gamelan, as well as visual arts practices in traditional villages and sacred sites. These activities serve as an expression of reverence and devotion to the universe, the heavens, and God Almighty (*Hyang Widhi Wasa*).







Bali Citta Pradesa is carried out at Besakih temple, Batur temple, Sakenan temple, and other *Parhyangan Jagat* sites. It encapsulates the tradition of *ngayah*, which has been a form of community service by ISI BALI since the founding of ASTI (Indonesian Dance Academy) in 1967. Recently, on April 13, 2025, during *Ngusaba Kadasa* at Ulun Danu Batur Temple, Kintamani, Bangli, ISI BALI held a site specific sacred performance *R'ta-Samasta-Citta*. This sacred performance involved hundreds of dancers and musicians—students and faculty members.

4. Bali Citta Samasta

SI BALI views its alumni as the core family who upholds the quality and reputation of this institution of higher education. The esteemed reputation of ISI BALI is greatly enhanced by the presence, creative works, and achievements of its graduates. Countless proud and emotional moments are etched through the accomplishments of ISI BALI alumni in various national and international stages. All these achievements proclaim the noble brilliance of ISI BALI. As a tribute to the legacy of alumni achievements and reputation, the platform **Bali-Citta Samasta (Alumni Arts Festival)** is dedicated.

The *Bali Citta Samasta* Festival was held for the first time from March 19 to April 2, 2024, with the theme *Manawa-Prabhawa-Manu* (the Platform of a Noble Generation). 



It is articulated through eleven activities, namely: (a) Bali-Dwipantara Widya (platform for archipelago talents); (b) Bali-Dwipantara Adirupa (Indonesian fine arts and design exhibition); (c) Bali-Dwipantara Adinatya (national arts and cultural performances); (d) Bali-Dwipantara Kanti (archipelago community initiatives); (e) Bali-Dwipantara Waskita (archipelago arts seminar); (f) Bali-Dwipantara Krama (archipelago narratives by indigenous maestros); (g) Bali-Dwipantara Yatra (archipelago village literature trip); (h) Bali-Dwipantara Diatmika (platform for archipelago maestros); (i) Bali-Dwipantara Karma (archipelago discovery network); (j) Bali-Dwipantara Bhakti (national collaboration arts performances); and (k) Bali-Dwipantara Nata Kerthi Nugraha (national-level arts awards).





Bali Sangga Dwipantara I

Bali Sangga Dwipantara I in 2021 carried the theme *Wana-Citta-Nuswantara*. This theme symbolizes the forest with its biodiversity, as the source of life in the Nusantara (Indonesian Archipelago). It reflects on and appreciates the arts and culture of the Nusantara to develop creative arts and design, in harmony with the spirit of environmental conservation. This first National Festival was held amid the Covid-19 pandemic, so exhibitions and art performances were conducted in online spaces.

The opening of *Bali Sangga Dwipantara* I coincided with the 26th undergraduate and postgraduate graduation ceremony, held on Monday, September 6, 2021. The scientific oration was delivered online by Goenawan Mohamad, titled *Conservation and Production of Novelty*. Bali Sangga Dwipantara I was officially opened by the Minister of Administrative and Bureaucratic Reform of Indonesia, Tjahjo Kumolo, S.H.

The national seminar Bali Dwipantara Waskita was themed *Wana-Empu-Nuswantara* (Arts Networks, Maestros, and the Environment). Speakers included Ni Putu Suastini Koster, Putu Fajar Arcana, Anak Agung Gede Rai Remawa, Hasan Aspahani, Lea Avilliani Azis, Kt. Suteja, Wayan Gede Yudana, Joko Pinurbo, Tjokorda Gede Putra Sukawati, and Otto Sidarta.



The Indonesian Visual Arts and Design Virtual Exhibition in *Bali-Dwipantara-Adi Rupa* featured 63 students and professional artists and designers, curated by Djuli Jati Prambudi, Wayan Karja, Ketut Muka, Pande Made Artadi, and Indah Tjahja Wulan. The Bali-Dwipantara Nata Kerthi Nugraha Award 2021 was given to I Wayan Gulendra, Tjokorda Istri Putra Padmini, Agus Nuramal, Tjokorda Istri Rai Partini, and Nungki Kusumastuti.



Bali Padma Bhuwana features 12 activities: (1) Bali-Bhuwana Widya (International Graduate Student Research Day); (2) Bali-Bhuwana Rupa (International Art Exhibition); (3) Bali-Bhuwana Lango (Global Performing Arts Festival); (4) Bali-Bhuwana Bhakti (Global Collaboration Movement); (5) Bali-Bhuwana Waskita (Global Arts Creativity Conference); (6) Bali-Bhuwana Yatra (Bali Arts Trip); (7) Bali-Bhuwana Karma (Global Initiative Scape); (8) Bali-Bhuwana Krama (Global Arts Trip); (9) Bali-Bhuwana Diatmika (Global Maestro Moment); (10) Bali-Bhuwana Kanti (Global Arts Project Network); (11) Bali-Bhuwana Mahottama Nugraha (The Highest International Award); and (12) Bali-Bhuwana Nata Kerthi Nugraha (International Award).



Bali Padma Bhuwana I

Bali Padma Bhuwana I, themed **Wana-Nata-Prana** (Nature-Creation-Soul), was inaugurated as part of the XVIII Dies Natalis series on Wednesday, July 28, 2021. This international festival was opened by the Indonesian Minister of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology, Nadiem Anwar Makarim, accompanied by a speech from the Governor of Bali, Dr. Wayan Koster. The keynote speech was delivered by the Indonesian Minister of Public Works, Dr. Ir. M. Basuki Hadimuljono, titled *Public Infrastructure Based on Art*. Bali Padma Bhuwana III

Bali Padma Bhuwana III, themed **Samudra-Samahita-Samasta** (**The Noble Vision of Maritime Civilization**), was opened as part of the 30th undergraduate, applied undergraduate, master's, and doctoral graduation ceremony and the 20th Dies Natalis on Friday, July 28, 2023, by the Director General of Higher Education, Research, and Technology, represented by the Deputy Director General, Prof. Tjitjik Sri Tjahjandarie, Ph.D., along with a welcome speech from the Bali Provincial Secretary, Dewa Indra. The international discussion Bali-Bhuwana Kanthi III featured speaker Yang Hanmo with the topic "*Modern Interpretation of Hanok*."

The **Bali-Bhuwana Bhakti** performance based on the theme **Manu-Maha-Mina**, blended various musical elements from Balinese and Javanese gamelan, and a mini western orchestra. The performance depicted the life of marine creatures in the ocean depths through lighting, costume design, and a stage prop resembling a giant fish. 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Bali Padma Bhuwana IV

Bali Padma Bhuwana IV, themed *Manawa-Murti-Manu* (The Awakening of Human Virtue), was opened during the 21st Dies Natalis and the 32nd undergraduate, applied undergraduate, master's, and doctoral graduation ceremony on Tuesday, July 30, 2024, by the Director General of Higher Education, Research, and Technology, Prof. Dr. rer.nat. Abdul Harris, M.Sc. The academic oration was delivered by



Goenawan Susatiyo Mohamad with the topic, Who Was Airlangga, King of Kediri, Java.

The Bali-Bhuwana Bhakti presented the theme *Manah-Wak-Manu* (Voices of Noble Sincerity), a performance of the vocal music genre called *Wajrasangita*. *Wajrasangita* was created based on the concept of *garbahita* — an artistic dialogue between vocal music and instrumental sounds combined with *tembang paraga* (character songs). The presence of live performers, both singers and musicians, were highlighted. *Wajrasangita* is a new form of performance, placing singers and musicians at the pinnacle of artistic achievement. Specifically, for the opening of Bali Padma Bhuwana IV, the performance glorified the awakening of noble humanity through *nuwur suksmaning rahayu* (the giving of blessings for well-being) honoring Jayeng Negari, Proclamators Bung Karno-Hatta, National Educator Ki Hajar Dewantara, Bali's freedom fighter Pulina Gusti Ngurah Rai, composer W.R. Soepratman, and master poet Chairil Anwar.

During Bali Padma Bhuwana IV, the strength of academics was presented through the platform, **Bali-Bhuwana Karma** with the themes *Nara-Bhuwana-Nirmala* (*Noble Human World*) featuring speaker Jeremy Mark Rosen, Ph.D., and *Nara-Bhuwana-Nadi* (*Global Human Virtue*) by Prof. Cai Yushui.

As part of Bali Padma Bhuwana IV, an **International Photography Exhibition** was held under the program **Bali Bhuwana Kanti**, and the theme *Nara-Bhuwana-Charma (Human, World, Dignity)*. The exhibition displayed 86 photographic works from 16 countries. This international exhibition hosted J.R. Bali Padma Bhuwana V

Bali Padma Bhuwana V, themed *Chantala-Bhuwana-Chandika* (Monumentalizing of Cosmic Movement), was opened during the 22nd Dies Natalis and the 35th undergraduate, applied undergraduate, master's, and doctoral graduation ceremony on Thursday, August 28th, 2025. To interpret the main theme, a new performing arts piece titled *Chantala-Bhuwana-Chandika* was composed and presented under *Bali-Bhuwana Bhakti* Program.

Bali-Bhuwana Waskita V held in collaboration between ISI BALI, Hankuk University of Foreign Studies (HUFS), and Korea Association of Malay-Indonesian Studies (KAMIS) themed *Pram-Bhuwana-Prana* (Reflecting 100 Years of Pramoedya Ananta Toer). The Minister of Culture of Indonesia Dr. Fadli Zon presents as a keynote speaker; Prof. Dr. Koh Young Hun (Professor of Hankuk University of Foreign Studies, Korea), Prof. Dr. Wayan Kun Adnyana (Professor of ISI BALI, Indonesia), Prof. Dr. Qie Lisha (Prof Peking University, China), and Happy Salma (Performance artist, Founder of Titi Mangsa Foundation, Indonesia) as invited speakers. Dr. Sukardi Rinakit (Indonesian Scholar) and Professor Made Arsiniwati (Chairperson of ISI BALI Senate) gave remarks on this occasion. In addition, 26 speakers presented their papers discussing *Pramoedya Ananta Toer's Earth* that explored his literary works, ideology, persona, and struggles from various perspectives.

7. Bali Nata Bhuwana

Bali Nata Bhuwana is a dissemination platform for learning outcomes as well as a forum to insure the quality of ISI BALI across various cities/regencies within the country and abroad. This platform serves to bring ISI BALI's brand and vision directly into the global art and design ecosystem. Bali Nata Bhuwana is based on strategic partnerships between ISI BALI and higher education institutions, art and cultural institutions globally, and international locations, in cooperation with the Indonesian Embassies abroad.

Bali Nata Bhuwana National activities include: a. Bali-Nata Adinatya (Kalang Kalangon Performing Arts); b. Bali-Nata Adirupa (Waskita Rupa Exhibition); c. Bali-Nata Diatmika (Kanda Wiku Seminar); d. Bali-Nata Cipta (Karma Hasta Workshop); e. Bali-Nata Widya (Lampah Aguron Benchmark Collaboration); dan f. Bali-Nata Kanti (National Cooperation).

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
9. The Asia Pacific's Axis Of Arts and Design

SI Bali initiated the establishment of the Bali-Global Axis of Arts and Design (B-GAAD) as a platform for dialogue, strategic partnerships, and collaboration among higher education institutions managing art and design programs across the Asia-Pacific region. B-GAAD holds the vision of fostering excellence in the sustainable governance of higher education in art and design, with a commitment to social welfare, upholding the values of local wisdom, and mainstreaming natural environmental conservation.

B-GAAD mission: (1) To foster dialogue and collaboration in order to enhance the quality of higher education in art and design; (2) To develop partnerships and programs aimed at improving community prosperity while upholding local wisdom values; (3) To create initiatives for the conservation of the natural environment; (4) To implement programs that contribute to the realization of a peaceful, justice, and prosperous world.

As an actualization of the B-GAAD vision and mission, eight main programs have been established, namely: (1) Bali-Global Arts and Design Symposium (B-GADS); (2) Bali-Global Performing Arts Map (B-GPAM); (3) Bali-Global Art Map Exhibition (B-GAME); (4) Bali-Global Innovative Design Map Exhibition (B-GIDME); (5) Bali-Global Encounter Figure (B-GEF); (6) Bali-Global Expo and Job Fair (B-GEJF); (7) B-GAAD Leaders' Summit; dan (8) Bali-Global Authentic Trip (B-GAT).







B-GAAD I was held from October 19 to 25, 2024, under the theme Kala-Manawa-Kalpa – Time-Human-Term (Waktu-Manusia-Momenta). B-GAAD I was attended by 12 universities, two Consulates General (the Consulates of Japan and Australia in Bali), and three cultural institutions (ARMA Museum, Tonyraka Art Gallery, and Komaneka Art Gallery). Participating universities included: Kazakh National Academy of Choreography, Kazakhstan; University of Western Australia; Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts, Singapore; National Academy of Arts, Culture and Heritage (ASWARA), Malaysia; Mahasarakham University, Thailand; Jiangxi Institute of Fashion Technology, China; Lasalle College of the Arts, Singapore; Okinawa Prefectural University of Arts, Japan; Kunitachi College of Music, Japan; Kyoto Saga University of Arts, Japan; Hankuk University of Foreign Studies, South Korea; and Youngsan University, South Korea. B-GAAD II will be held from October 26 to 31, 2025, with the theme Tutur-Bhuwana-Tuwuh – Myths-World-Memories.

10. B-GADS

he 2024 Bali-Global Arts and Design Symposium (B-GADS), themed "The Role of Arts and Design Innovation in Achieving People's Prosperity in a Sustainable Environment," aimed to explore how art and design can positively impact society while maintaining a harmonious balance between humans and nature.

The 2024 B-GADS featured three keynote speakers: the Consul General of Japan, *Katsutoshi Miyakawa*; the Australian Consul, *Amelia Ekkel*; and the Rector of ISI Bali, *Prof. Dr. I Wayan 'Kun' Adnyana*. In addition, 28 invited speakers participated, including: *Prof. Izumi Hatano* (Okinawa Prefectural University of Arts); *Prof. Tolysbayeva Zh.* (Kazakh National Academy of Choreography); *Prof. K. Azril Ismail* (ASWARA, Malaysia); *Georgette Yu* (Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts); *Dr. Jean Couteau* (France); and *Ass. Prof. Paul Trinidad* (University of Western Australia).
























11. G-PAM

he 2024 Bali-Global Performing Arts Map (B-GPAM) adopted the theme "Body, Nature, and Balance," exploring the relationship between the human body and the universe. This inaugural B-GPAM featured the colossal performance Candet Ding Padmeswari Kalpa as the highlight of the B-GAAD I 2024 opening ceremony. The Candet Ding Padmeswari Kalpa performance represents a contemporary transformation of 100 Years of Cak, blending the classical stylization of Pagambuhan, choral vocal chants, and the mystical depth of Selonding music, the sweet tones of Balinese flute, and the grandeur of Western orchestration. Padmeswari Kalpa symbolizes the Padmabhuwana script—a sacred representation of Balinese-Javanese traditional wisdom—exalted in the form of Saraswati, the great goddess of knowledge and the eternal light guiding the course of history and civilization. Candet Ding Padmeswari Kalpa is a colossal work of performing arts, a narration of time, a seeker's spiritual journey, and a chronicle of sacred literary ascension across the cosmos.



B-GPAM II, to be held in **2025**, carries the theme "*Myths in the Creation of New Repertoires*," showcasing diverse performances that interpret living local myths embedded in the cultures of the Asia-Pacific region. The myths presented are expected to embody a spirit of **preservation and celebration of true humanity**. This year's program invites **universities across Asia-Pacific** to send **one dance team contingent**, consisting of at least **five dancers per group**.













12. B-GAME

he Bali-Global Art Map Exhibition (B-GAME), with the theme "Bodies in and around Nature," explored the artistic relationship between humans and the world through various media such as painting, installation, sculpture, and video. B-GAME I featured 106 artists presenting 119 works, held across three iconic venues: ARMA Museum exhibited 55 works by 49 artists; Komaneka Art Gallery exhibited 41 works by 34 artists; Tonyraka Art Gallery exhibited 23 works by 23 artists.

For **B-GAAD II 2025**, the exhibition will carry the theme "Myths and Memories in the Creation of New Forms," intended as an exploration of new stylistic and aesthetic approaches through thematic excavation rooted in **myths and memories**. It offers a spirit of **preservation** while celebrating **authentic humanity** through various media such as **painting**, **installation**, **sculpture**, **photography**, **video art**, **and multimedia**.

he Bali-Global Art Map Exhibition (B-GAME), with the theme "Bodies in and around Nature," is a design exploration of the relationship between humans and the world through various media such as digital prints, prototype designs, textiles, and hand-drawn design illustrations. The exhibition was held at Nata Citta Art Space (NCAS), featuring 63 designers showcasing 72 design works. B-GEF II in 2025 will carry the theme "Myth Narratives in the Works of Renowned Maestros or Academics," offering a dialogue on individual and collective relationships through **creative collaboration** involving maestros, artists, cultural figures, or critics, presented in a **workshop format.**



15. B-GEJF

ali-Global Expo and Job Fair (B-GEJF) is an exhibition event held in collaboration with several strategic partners, aiming to expand networks among students, alumni, and professionals in the fields of art and design. It took place as part of the Bali-Global Axis of Arts and Design (B-GAAD) series over three days, from October 21 to 23, 2024. Students, lecturers, alumni, education staff, B-GAAD delegates from both domestic and international institutions, and the general public enthusiastically visited each booth, enjoying the products while engaging in dialogue with the tenants.



The Expo served as a platform for showcasing innovative products from student start-ups at ISI BALI (formerly ISI Denpasar). They built a conceptual connection between business practices, brand identity, and the products they created. These students successfully formulated a unique relational concept between the three components—business, branding, and product—in a way that reflects the genius of Generation Z.

The Bali Job Fair featured four companies: CV. Casa Annie, Kaustubha, The Keranjang Bali, and Biasa Art. This event allowed ISI Denpasar alumni to gain access to employment opportunities, entrepreneurial networks, and potential partnerships.



The creation of ISI BALI's academics, maintained as a creative and innovation hub, not only resonates with the slogan: Global-Balí Arts and Creativity Centre Hub (G-BACCH), but also began with the establishment of the Freedom of Learning-Independent Campus (Merdeka Belajar-Kampus Merdeka) Curriculum, which the latest curriculum named an Impactful Campus (Kampus Berdampak), following the national government mandate. 18. PROGRAM DOKTOR


he Doctoral Program at ISI BALI consists of two study programs: the Doctoral Program in Arts and the Doctoral Program in Design. The Doctoral Program in Arts has been offered since 2017, while the Doctoral Program in Design was launched in 2024.

a. Doctoral Program of Arts

The Doctoral Program in Arts was established based on the Decree of the Minister of Research, Technology, and Higher Education of the Republic of Indonesia, number 137/KPT/1/2017, regarding the Opening of the Doctoral Program in Arts at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar, dated February 8, 2017.

This program envisioned as a doctoral arts study program characterized by excellence and global reputation in arts studies and arts creation based on local wisdom and advances in creative innovation. The mission of the Doctoral Program in Arts includes: (1) Delivering higher education in the arts at KKNI (Indonesian National Qualification Framework) level 9 through multidisciplinary, interdisciplinary, or transdisciplinary approaches; (2) Conducting learning, research, and creation of arts grounded in local wisdom and innovative creativity; (3) Conducting community services oriented toward solving societal problems; and (4) Discovering new propositions/methods of arts creation.

The characteristics of the Doctoral Program in Arts at ISI BALI includes prioritizing multidisciplinary, interdisciplinary, or transdisciplinary approaches; addressing societal problems; advancing arts and culture based on local wisdom; discovering new propositions/methods in art creation; and fostering innovation and creativity. The Doctoral Program in Arts has been well-received by the academic and professional communities, as evidenced by an increase in new student enrollment. The Doctoral Program in Arts has achieved an "Excellence" (Unggul) rating by the National Accredition Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT).

b. Doctoral Program of Design

The Doctoral Program in Design was established based on the Decree of the Minister of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology of the Republic of Indonesia, number 480/E/0/2024, granting permission to open the Doctoral Program in Design at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar (ISI Denpasar), Bali Province, dated July 15, 2024. The vision of the Doctoral Program in Design at ISI BALI is to become a doctoral program that is characterized by excellence and a strong global reputation in the study and creation of design based on the nobility of Balinese culture and Indonesian wisdom, as well as innovation. This program, (1) focuses on the research and creation in design through multidisciplinary, interdisciplinary, or transdisciplinary approaches; (2) explores diverse design disciplines such as Interior Design, Visual Communication Design, Fashion Design, Product Design, Architecture, Animation, and various digital and conventional design fields; and (3) emphasize human dignity, social responsibility, solving societal problems (problem-solving), technological adaptation, environmental sustainability, and the utilization of digital technology.

The mission of the Doctoral Program in Design at ISI BALI is: (1) To provide higher education in design at KKNI Level 9 (nine); (2) To implement multidisciplinary, interdisciplinary, or transdisciplinary approaches; (3) To conduct learning, research, and design based on Balinese nobility and Indonesian wisdom as well as innovation; (4) To carry out research and community service oriented toward solving societal problems and discovering new design propositions/methods.



a. Master Program of Arts



The vision of the Master's Program in Arts is to become an excellent study program that is globally competitive in the study and creation of arts based on local wisdom, with a multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary approach. The Master's Program in Arts has achieved an "Excellence" (Unggul) rating by the National Accredition Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT).

b. Master Program of Design





19. UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAM

he Bachelor's Programs at ISI BALI are organized under two faculties: the Faculty of Performing Arts (FSP) and the Faculty of Fine Arts and Design (FSRD). Both faculties offer comprehensive education grounded in creativity and innovation, aiming to produce graduates who are not only skilled in the fields of arts and design but also capable of contributing to the development of globally competitive creative industries.

The Faculty of Performing Arts (FSP) has 7 Bachelor's Programs in Arts, providing a strong foundation for students to deeply explore various disciplines of performing arts. These programs include: (1) Dance; (2) Karawitan; (3) Puppetry; (4) Music; (5) Performing Arts Education; (6) Theatre; and (7) Digital Business (Digital Management for Arts).

1. The Bachelor's Program in Dance was established based on the Decree of the Director General of Higher Education, Ministry of Education and Culture of the Republic of Indonesia, number 252/DIKTI/Kep/1996, concerning Undergraduate Programs within the Indonesian Arts College (STSI) Denpasar, dated July 11, 1996. The program's name was changed from Bachelor of Arts in Dance to Bachelor's Program in Dance according to the Decree of the Minister of Research, Technology, and Higher Education of the Republic of Indonesia, Number 456/KPT/I/2018, concerning the Change of Program Names at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar in the city of Denpasar, dated May 22, 2018.

Graduates of the Bachelor's Program in Dance are qualified as Bachelor of Arts (S.Sn) holders with excellent, competitive, and reliable competencies. They are able to apply knowledge of cultural arts, dance skills, and reasoning to compete globally. The graduate profile points to qualifications as Researchers, Creators, Performers, Instructors, and Entrepreneurs in the field of dance. Graduates hold a KKNI level 6 qualification with the degree of Sarjana Seni (S.Sn). The Dance Study Program has achieved an "A" rating according to the National Accreditation Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT).

2. The Bachelor's Program in Karawitan was established based on the Decree of the Director General of Higher Education, Ministry of Education and Culture of the Republic of Indonesia, number 252/DIKTI/Kep/1996, concerning Undergraduate Programs at the Indonesian Arts College (STSI) Denpasar, dated July 11, 1996.

Graduates of the Karawitan Program have primary competencies as researchers, creators, and performers of Karawitan in accordance with KKNI level 6. As researchers, graduates are able to apply various theories to critically, contextually, and interdisciplinarily related to Karawitan. Researchers are competent as researchers, curators, critics, and consultants in Karawitan. As creators, graduates can compose Karawitan works including traditional, innovative, contemporary music, digital music compositions, as well as Karawitan for other purposes (such as dance, theatre, dance-drama, and film music scoring). As performers, graduates are able to present/play classical, traditional, modern, and contemporary Karawitan works. The Karawitan Study Program has achieved an "A" rating according to the National Accreditation Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT). In addition, The Karawitan Study Program has achieved International Accreditation by the Agency for Quality Assurance (AQAS) in 2025.

3. The Bachelor's Program in Puppetry (Pedalangan) was established based on the Decree of the Director General of Higher Education, Ministry of Education and Culture of the Republic of Indonesia, number 252/DIKTI/Kep/1996, regarding Undergraduate Programs at the Indonesian Arts College (STSI) Denpasar, dated July 11, 1996.

Graduates of the Bachelor's Program in Puppetry (Pedalangan) are qualified as Bachelor of Arts (S.Sn) holders with excellent, competitive, and reliable competencies. They are able to apply knowledge of cultural arts, puppetry skills, and reasoning, ready to compete globally. The graduate profile points to qualifications as Researchers, Creators, Performers, Instructors, and Entrepreneurs in the field of puppetry. Graduates hold a KKNI level 6 qualification with the degree of Sarjana Seni (S.Sn). The Puppetry (Pedalangan) Study Program has achieved an "Excellence" (Unggul) rating according to the National Accreditation Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT).

4. The Performing Arts Education Study Program was established based on the Decree of the Minister of Education and Culture of the Republic of Indonesia, Number: 433/E/O/2013, regarding the License for the Implementation of the Drama, Dance, and Music Arts Education Study Program (Bachelor's Degree) at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar in Denpasar, dated April 12, 2013. The name change from the Drama, Dance, and Music Arts Education Study Program (Undergraduate Program) to the Performing Arts Education Study Program (Undergraduate Program) was made in accordance with the Decree of the Minister of Research, Technology, and Higher Education of the Republic of Indonesia, Number 456/KPT/I/2018, concerning the Change of Study Program Name at the Indonesian Institute of

the Arts Denpasar in Denpasar City, dated May 22, 2018.

The graduate profile of students from the Performing Arts Education Study Program at the Faculty of Performing Arts, Indonesian Institute of the Arts (ISI) Denpasar, in accordance with the program's vision and mission, includes roles as Educator, Researcher, Creator, Performer, Entrepreneur, and Cultural Arts Facilitator based on local (indigenous) wisdom with a universal perspective, aligned with the Indonesian National Qualifications Framework (KKNI) Level 6 (Analyst level). Arts **Educator** refers to the competency of teaching in educational units such as Early Childhood Education, Elementary School, Junior High School, and Senior High School/Vocational School or equivalent, particularly in the subject of Cultural Arts, especially performing arts. Arts Education Researcher refers to competencies as a performing arts researcher, writer, and curator. Cultural Arts Facilitator refers to competencies as an instructor, coach, tutor, and mentor in non-formal educational institutions or community-based learning activities. Arts Creator refers to competencies in choreography, Karawitan composer, music composer, and dance-drama director. Arts Performer refers to competencies as a drama actor, dancer, Karawitan performer, musician, and makeup artist. Arts Education Entrepreneur refers to competencies as an owner/manager of non-formal arts education institutions and art educational event organizers. These graduate profiles are embedded in the graduates of the Performing Arts Education Study Program, who earn the academic degree of Bachelor of Education (S.Pd). The Performing Arts Education Study Program has achieved "Excellence" (Unggul) rating according to the Independent Accreditation Body for Education (LAMDIK).

5. The Music Study Program was established based on the Decree of the Minister of Education and Culture of the Republic of Indonesia, Number: 433/E/O/2013, concerning the License for the Implementation of the Music Arts Study Program (Bachelor's Degree) at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar in Denpasar, dated September 27, 2013. The name change from the Music Arts Study Program (Undergraduate Program) to the Music Study Program (Undergraduate Program) was made in accordance with the Decree of the Minister of Research, Technology, and Higher Education of the Republic of Indonesia, Number 456/KPT/I/2018, concerning the Change of Study Program Name at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar in Denpasar City, dated May 22, 2018.

The primary graduate profile of the Music Study Program at ISI BALI is **music studies and music composition** with skills in writing orchestration, arrangements, songs, or musical compositions, with

understanding of Western music theory as well as knowledge of Indonesian traditional music. This enables graduates to create and perform local and global music. Their understanding of music theory and related knowledge is further strengthened by proficiency in **sound engineering technologies**, such as sound systems, music software (Digital Audio Workstations), and the utilization of the internet as a medium for actualization, publication, and promotion of their works. The Music Study Program has achieved a "B" rating according to the National Accreditation Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT).



The Digital Business (Digital Management for Arts) Program focuses on the study, creation, and realization of businesses through digital platforms, integrating art, design, digital innovation, culture, business management, information systems, and technology. It emphasizes the mainstreaming of business conceptualization, planning, and implementation through digital means. Art Study Program (Program Studi Seni Rupa Murni) to **Fine Art Study Program** (Program Studi Seni Murni) was made in accordance with the Decree of the Minister of Research, Technology, and Higher Education of the Republic of Indonesia, Number 456/KPT/I/2018, concerning the Change of Study Program Names at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar in Denpasar City, dated May 22, 2018.

The graduate profile of the Fine Art Study Program (Seni Murni) aligns with Level 6 of the Indonesian National Qualifications Framework (KKNI) and includes competencies as Art Researcher, Artist, Fine Art Educator, and Entrepreneur in the field of fine art, grounded in local wisdom with a universal outlook. As a Researcher, graduates are capable of working as art researchers, curators, and critics. These graduate profiles are attached to graduates of the Fine Art Study Program, who are awarded the academic degree Bachelor of Arts (S.Sn.). The Fine Arts Study Program has achieved an "Excellence" (Unggul) rating according to the National Accreditation Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT). The Crafts Study Program was established based on a Decree from the Director General of Higher Education regarding the License to Implement Undergraduate (S1) Study Programs at Udayana University, Number: 304/D/T/2002, dated February 12, 2002. The name change from **Craft Arts Study Program** (Program Studi Kriya Seni) to **Crafts Study Program** (Program Studi Kriya) was made in accordance with the Decree of the Minister of Research, Technology, and Higher Education of the Republic of Indonesia, Number 1017/KPT/I/2018, concerning the Name Change of the Craft Arts Study Program to the Crafts Study Program at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar in Denpasar City, dated November 15, 2018.

The graduate profile of the Crafts Study Program includes the ability to conceptualize, design, create, analyse, and present innovative craft products that are based on local wisdom with a universal perspective. Graduates are proficient in using hand-drawn sketches as well as 2D and 3D design software to realize craft designs. They are capable of transforming designs into prototype creations and producing various craft products that suited to market demands, while also solving technical field

problems related to societal needs in the field of crafts. The Craft Study Program has achieved an "A" rating according to the National Accreditation Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT).

3. The Interior Design Study Program was established based on a Decree from the Director General of Higher Education regarding the License to Implement Undergraduate (S1) Study Programs at Udayana University, Number: 304/D/T/2002, dated February 12, 2002.

The graduate profile of students from the Interior Design Study Program at the Faculty of Visual Art and Design (FSRD), ISI BALI, aligned with the program's vision and mission, includes roles as **Researcher**, **Creator**, **Presenter**, **and Entrepreneur** in Interior Design based on local (indigenous) wisdom with a universal perspective, in accordance with KKNI Level 6. **Researcher** refers to analytical competencies with roles including consultants, critics, educators (academic), conceptualizers, and designers. **Creator** refers to interior designers, furniture designers, landscape designers, and interior elements decorator. **Entrepreneur** refers to contractors, capable of managing interior design project in the field of interior design at local, national, and international levels creatively and professionally. The Interior Design Study Program has achieved an "Excellence" (Unggul) rating according to the National Accreditation Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT).

4. The Visual Communication Design Study Program was established based on a Decree from the Director General of Higher Education regarding the License to Implement Undergraduate (S1) Study Programs at Udayana University, Number: 304/D/T/2002, dated February 12, 2002.

The graduate profile of students from the Visual Communication Design Study Program at the Faculty of Visual Art and Design (FSRD), ISI BALI, in accordance with the vision, mission, goals, and objectives of the Study Program, includes roles as **Researcher, Creator, Educator, and Entrepreneur** in the field of Visual Communication Design, based on local wisdom with a universal perspective, aligned with KKNI Level 6. The roles of Researchers and Educators indicate analytical competence, projected as consultants, and include career paths such as researchers, writers, educators (academics), and concept developers. These broad competencies are relevant to various professional fields including advertising agencies, mass media, publishing and printing companies, production houses, clothing distribution outlets (distros), and creative studios at local, national, and international levels. The role of Creator also reflects analytical competence, projected as Visual Communication Designers, capable of developing design knowledge through creative practices. Graduates may work as illustrators, animators, comic artists, journalists, cartoonists, font designers, photographers, copywriters, YouTubers, mural designers, web

designers, game designers, animators, and content creators. The role of Entrepreneur reflects analytical competence projected in professions such as entrepreneur, visual merchandiser, event organizer, advertiser, creativepreneur, and art director. These graduate profiles are embedded in all graduates of the Visual Communication Design Study Program, who are awarded the academic degree of Bachelor of Design (S.Ds.). The Visual Communication Design Study Program has achieved an "Excellence" (Unggul) rating according to the National Accreditation Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT).

5. The Photography Study Program was established based on a Decree from the Director General of Higher Education regarding the License to Implement the Photography Study Program at the Undergraduate Level (S1) at the Indonesian College of the Arts (Sekolah Tinggi Seni Indonesia), Denpasar, Number: 303/D/T/2002, dated February 12, 2002.

The graduate profile of the Photography Study Program at the Faculty of Visual Art and Design (FSRD), ISI Denpasar, in accordance with the vision and mission of the Study Program, includes competencies as **Researcher**, **Creator**, **Educator**, **and Entrepreneur** in the field of Photography, based on local (indigenous) wisdom with a universal perspective, aligned with KKNI Level 6: **Researcher** refers to analytical competencies, projected as **researchers**, **writers**, **critics**, **consultants**, **and photography curators**. **Creator** refers to competencies as **photographers** in commercial, journalistic, digital media, and artistic fields, as well as social media content creators. **Educator** refers to analytical competencies projected as **instructors**, **speakers**, **extension agents**, **cultural mentors**, **and photography tutors**. **Entrepreneur** refers to competencies as business owners of **photo and digital media studios**, **printing services**, **and photography equipment rentals**, photography exhibition event organizers, and managers of photography galleries/museums that provide photo stocks for media and other public publications. Entrepreneurs run their business processes creatively, innovatively, and professionally to meet the competitive demands of the photography field at local, national, and international levels. The Photography Study Program has achieved an "Excellence" (Unggul) rating according to the National Accreditation Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT).


6. The Product Design Study Program was established based on the Decree of the Minister of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology of the Republic of Indonesia, Number 155/E/O/2022, concerning the License to Open the Master of Arts Education Study Program and the Product Design Study Program (Undergraduate) at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar in Denpasar City, dated March 11,

2022. The Product Design Study Program (Undergraduate) focuses on the development of creative and innovative product designs, taking into account aspects of aesthetics, ergonomics, and sustainability.

7. The Architecture Study Program was established based on the Decree of the Minister of Higher Education, Science, and Technology of the Republic of Indonesia, Number 336/B/O/2025, concerning the authorization for the opening of the Undergraduate Program in Architecture and the Undergraduate Program in Digital Business at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts (ISI) Bali, located in Denpasar City. This program envisions becoming a character-driven, excellent, and globally reputable architectural studies and design program rooted in the noble craftsmanship traditions (*perundagian*) of Bali, the architectural heritage of the Indonesian archipelago, and sustainable design principles.

The program focuses on the study and design of architecture inspired by the noble values of Balinese *perundagian*, Nusantara architecture, and innovative sustainable design. Its academic exploration and creative practice engage with the richness of traditional, modern, and contemporary architecture. The program prioritizes architectural thinking and design that promote human dignity, cultural preservation, environmental sustainability, and the integration of digital technology.

Graduates of the Undergraduate Program in Architecture at ISI Bali are expected to be competent in four main profiles: researchers, educators, designers, and entrepreneurs, in accordance with the Indonesian National Qualifications Framework (KKNI) Level 6. As researchers and educators, graduates are qualified to work as consultants, researchers, writers, curators, architectural planners, and academics. As designers, graduates are projected to become building architects, landscape architects, and urban planners. As entrepreneurs, graduates are prepared for careers as contractors, developers, event organizers, and architectural material business owners. Graduates of this program earn the academic title Sarjana Arsitektur (S.Ars.).

21. APPLIED BACHELOR'S PROGRAM


he **Applied Bachelor's Degree Programs** in Arts and Design at ISI BALI are under the Faculty of Visual Art and Design (FSRD). These programs are designed to provide applied education oriented towards industrial practice, with the goal of producing professionals who are ready to enter the workforce immediately. These Applied Bachelor's Programs focus on developing practical skills and technical expertise that are highly needed in the contemporary arts and design fields. The programs include: (1) Fashion Design; (2) Film and Television Production; and (3) Animation.

1. The Applied Bachelor's Program in Fashion Design was established based on the Decree of the Minister of Education and Culture of the Republic of Indonesia, Number: 243/E/O/2012, regarding the Implementation of the Fashion Design Study Program (D-IV) at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar, dated July 23, 2012. The name was changed from the Applied Bachelor of Fashion Design Study Program to the Applied Bachelor's Program in Fashion Design (Program Studi Desain Mode) in accordance with the Decree of the Minister of Research, Technology, and Higher Education of the Republic of Indonesia, Number 456/KPT/I/2018, concerning the Change of Study Program Names at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar in Denpasar City, dated May 22, 2018.

The Fashion Design Study Program has **seven graduate profiles**, namely: (1) **Fashion Designer**, able to work as a professional fashion designer, either in companies or private businesses; (2) **Textile Designer**, able to work as a textile designer with the ability to create designs both traditionally and digitally according to the needs of the fashion industry; (3) **Patternmaker**, able to work as a pattern maker for men's, women's, and children's clothing, both manually and digitally, according to the needs of the fashion industry; (4) **Fashion Stylist**, able to work as a stylist, including makeup and hairstyling in traditional, modern, and contemporary styles; (5) **Fashion Illustrator**, able to work as a fashion illustrator using both manual and digital techniques; (6) **Fashion Consultant**, able to work as a fashion consultant who understands the cultural, historical, trend, business, and production technique aspects of the fashion industry; (7) **Fashion Journalist**, able to work as a journalist, critic, or curator who has insight and knowledge about the fashion industry. The **Applied Bachelor's Program in Fashion Design** has achieved an "Excellence" (Unggul) rating according to the National Accreditation Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT). In addition, this program has achieved International Accreditation by the Agency for Quality Assurance (AQAS) in 2025.

- 2. The Applied Bachelor's Program in Film and Television Production was established based on the Decree of the Minister of Education and Culture of the Republic of Indonesia regarding the License to Operate, Number: 146/E/O/2013, concerning the Television and Film Study Program, Diploma IV (D-IV) at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar, dated April 22, 2013. The name was changed from the Diploma Four Television and Film Study Program to the Applied Bachelor's Program in Film and Television Production in accordance with the Decree of the Minister of Research, Technology, and Higher Education of the Republic of Indonesia, Number 456/KPT/I/2018, regarding the Change of Study Program Names at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar in Denpasar City, dated May 22, 2018. The Film and Television Production Applied Bachelor's Program equips students with the skills to work in the rapidly growing film and television industry and to develop innovations in creating audiovisual works. The Applied Bachelor's Program in Film and Television Production has achieved an "Excellence" (Unggul) rating according to the National Accreditation Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT).
- **3. The Applied Bachelor's Program in Animation** was established based on the Decree of the Minister of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology of the Republic of Indonesia, Number 105/D/OT/2022, concerning the License to Open the Applied Bachelor's Program in Animation at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar in Denpasar City, dated April 25, 2022.

ThegraduateprofileoftheAppliedBachelor'sPrograminAnimationatFSRDISIBALIIncludescompetencies as creators, mentors, and entrepreneurs in the field of animation. **Creators** refer to competencies such as: 2D & 3D animators, directors, storywriters, scriptwriters, inbetweeners, storyboard artists, digital illustrators, character designers, 3D modelers, 3D riggers, layout artists, lighting artists, compositors, art directors, creative directors, sound designers, video editors, 2D & 3D visual effects artists, concept artists, and animation supervisors. **Mentors** refer to competencies as educators (academics), tutors, trainers, instructors, cultural consultants, and conceptualizer. **Entrepreneurs** refer to competencies as producers, entrepreneurs, creativepreneurs, and art directors.

22. INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM

he **International Program** at ISI BALI is regulated by the Rector Regulation No. 7 of 2022, concerning the Short Course and Cultural Arts Residency Program at the Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar. The types of these programs are: (1) Global-Bali Arts Short Course Programme (G-BASC); (2) Global-Bali Arts Residency Programme (G-BAR); (3) Bali-International Project for Arts and Design Studies (B-IPADS); and (4) Global-Bali Arts and Cultural Advanced Management (G-BACAM)

- **1. ISI BALI Short Course and Residency Programs:** The **ISI BALI Short Course in Arts and Culture**, called the *Global-Bali Arts Short Course Programme (G-BASC)*, is a short course program in arts and culture designed for both foreigners and Indonesian citizens. This program offers a set of courses equivalent to 10 (ten) credits, providing participants with an opportunity to deepen their knowledge and skills intensively in the field of Balinese arts and culture.
- **2. The ISI BALI Arts and Culture Residency Program**, known as the *Global-Bali Arts Residency Programme* (*G-BAR*), is a short-term visit program for foreigners and Indonesian citizens where participants engage in various daily arts and cultural activities. This program is designed to give participants the opportunity to experience authentic collaborations with local artists, explore art practices, and develop their artworks within Bali's creative environment.
- **3. The Collaboration Program with Germany Studies Network,** called the *Bali-International Project for Arts and Design Studies (B-IPADS)*, aims to strengthen international relations in arts and design through collaboration with institutions and academics in Germany. This program that offers a set of courses equivalent to 20 (twenty) credits, provides a platform for students and professionals to develop joint projects from global perspective in arts and design studies.
- **4. The Korea Residency Program**, in collaboration with *Arts and Culture Magazine Korea*, known as the *Global-Bali Arts and Cultural Advanced Management (G-BACAM)*, offers participants the opportunity to participate in an arts and culture residency in Bali. The focus is on advanced arts and culture management and sharing knowledge and best practices between Bali and Korea in arts and cultural management.









23. ARTS AND DESIGN RESEARCH

A. Research, Creation, and Dissemination of Art and Design (P2DSD)

The Research, Creation, and Dissemination of Art and Design (P2DSD) at ISI BALI is an academic activity scheme that integrates research, the creation of art and design works, and the dissemination of outputs to the academic community and the public. This flagship program at ISI BALI serves as a platform for lecturers and students to develop knowledge as well as art and design practices based on research, creative exploration, and publication. The program is funded by ISI BALI's DIPA (Budget Implementation List) and has produced various works that have been widely disseminated.

B. Facilitation of Intellectual Property Rights

ISI BALI facilitates the registration of Intellectual Property Copyrights to motivate the academic community to protect intellectual works, whether in the form of art, design, or scientific works. ISI BALI has an Intellectual Property centre called Kerthi Widya Mahardika. A total of 86 works received copyright certificates in 2021. This number significantly increased to 251 works in 2022, and 258 works from 2023 to 2024.

C. Doctoral Dissertation Research (PDD)

ISI BALI is committed to strengthening the capacity of its faculty members through doctoral education. This effort is supported by the Doctoral Dissertation Research (PDD) competition, which started in 2022, to encourage research for academics or lecturers currently pursuing their doctoral dissertation. This competition aims to enhance the quality of advanced research relevant to the fields of art, design, digital media, and culture, which are the focus areas at ISI BALI. A total of 5 lecturers received PDD funding in 2022; 3 lecturers in 2023; 5 lecturers in 2024; and 9 lecturers in 2025.

D. Community Service Competition (PKM)

The Community Service Competition (PKM) is a funding program aimed at encouraging academics to apply their expertise and research outcomes for community empowerment through arts and culture. This program is a priority for ISI BALI in actualizing the Tri Dharma of Higher Education, particularly in community service based on arts and design. The PKM competition brings together faculty members

and students to empower village community members through their local arts and culture.

Here are some real examples of PKM results from ISI BALI that have benefited communities: Development of Wayang Wong accompaniment in Pejeng Kangin Village (2024); Legong Pelayon dance training in Denpasar (2024); Revitalization of Kali Unda tourism efforts to improve the village economy (2023); Training in making recycled souvenir products based on the 3R principle at Abiansemal High School (2023); and Training for Cak Wanita Tri Puspa Giri in Gianyar (2022).

E. Ph.Ds Mentored by Full Professors Program

Ph.Ds Mentored by Full Professors (Guru Besar Mentor Doktor - GBMD) Program was established during the inauguration of ISI BALI. GBMD serves as a platform for professors to mentor Associate Professor faculty members (*Lektor Kepala*) to produce reputable scholarly works, aiming to accelerate promotion to Full Professors (*Guru Besar*). This program enhances the quality and capacity of faculty members as well as the institutional development of ISI BALI.

s of early 2025, ISI BALI has 17 active Professors with diverse expertise in arts and design. The Faculty of Performing Arts has 8 Professors, while the Faculty of Fine Arts and Design has 9 Professors. In addition to Professors, ISI BALI is also supported by professional practitioner lecturers. Both Professors and professional practitioner lecturers at ISI BALI have demonstrated dedication, excellence in creative works, and have strong academic reputations.

Prof. Dr. Wayan 'Kun' Adnyana is a Professor of Art History. He has held leadership roles such as Rector of ISI Denpasar (ISI BALI) for the 2021–2025 period and Head of the Bali Provincial Culture Office from 2019 to 2021. Prof. Kun received the Dharma Kusuma Award from the Governor of Bali in 2024; the Cultural Award from the Minister of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology in 2023; and the World Peace Artist Award from Arts and Culture Magazine, Korea in 2023. He has held 17 solo exhibitions in Australia, Taiwan, the United States, Poland, and Indonesia.

Prof. Dr. I Ketut Muka P. is a Professor of Craft Arts (Seni Kriya) with a leadership career as Vice Rector for General Affairs and Finance for the 2021–2025 period. He received the Sewaka Nugraha Award from the Governor of Bali, Dr. Ir. I Wayan Koster, M.M. Prof. Muka is a ceramist who also manages the Pendet Museum in Nyuh Kuning, Ubud.

Prof. Dr. I Komang Sudirga is a Professor of Karawitan Arts Studies. He served as Vice Rector for Planning and Cooperation from 2021 to 2025 and Dean of the Faculty of Performing Arts from 2017 to 2021. Prof. Sudirga is the Chairman of the Bali Provincial Cultural Assembly for the 2021–2026 period. He authored the books *Kebangkitan Pesantian di Era Globalisasi* (The Revival of Pesantian in the Era of Globalization, 2018) and *Cekepung Musik Vokal Bali: Kajian Teks dan Konteks* (Cekepung Balinese Vocal Music: Textual and Contextual Study, 2005).

Prof. Dr. Anak Agung Gede Bagus Udayana is a Professor of Visual Communication Design, currently serving as Vice Rector of Academics, Student Affairs, and Alumni. He served as Dean of the Faculty of Fine Arts and Design from 2021 to 2025. He is active as a curator at the National Achievement Center, an evaluator

for new study programs, and an assessor for the National Accreditation Board for Higher Education (BAN-PT). As a designer, he has created branding and logos for various public and private institutions.

Prof. Dr. I Wayan Mudra is a Professor in the field of Ceramic Craft Science. He teaches, supervises, and examines students across Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral programs at ISI BALI. He has held leadership roles as Secretary of the Institute for Research and Community Service and as Coordinator of the Master's Program in Arts. Prof. Mudra received the Best Research Output Award (Widya Nata Kerti Nugraha) in 2020 from the Rector of ISI Denpasar, Prof. Dr. I Gede Arya Sugiartha.

Prof. Dr. I Nyoman Sedana is a Professor specializing in Traditional Theater. He conducted international research at Yale University focusing on the wayang collection at the Yale University Arts Gallery, using the approach "Sacred Interplay of Form-Literature-Divinity." Currently, he supervises, teaches, and examines students in the Master's and Doctoral Arts Programs at ISI BALI, and serves actively as a lecturer workload (BKD) assessor at ISI BALI.

Prof. Dr. I Nyoman Artayasa is a Professor of Interior Design. He has served as Vice Rector for Academic Affairs from 2013-2017 and 2017-2021. Currently, he supervises, teaches, and examines in the Master's and Doctoral Arts Programs at ISI BALI and actively works as a lecturer workload (BKD) assessor at ISI BALI.

Prof. Dr. I Made Gede Arimbawa is a Professor of Craft Arts. He won the Higher Education Basic Research Competition with the project titled: *Existence of Upcycled Coconut Shell Waste as the Development of Creative Craft Product Variants Based on Local Genius in Banjarangkan Village, Klungkung.*

Prof. Dr. I Gede Mugi Raharja is a Professor specializing in Interior Design Studies. She currently supervises, teaches, and examines in the Master's and Doctoral Art Programs at ISI BALI and serves actively as a BKD assessor at ISI BALI.

Prof. Dr. Ida Ayu Trisnawati is a Professor in Dance Studies. She actively teaches, supervises, and examines at the Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral programs at ISI BALI. She has authored books titled *Introduction to Dance History* (2018) and *History of Art and Culture* (2021).

Prof. Dr. I Wayan Swandi is a Professor in Visual Communication Design and Culture. He has served as Vice Dean for Student Affairs at the Faculty of Fine Arts and Design from 2004-2008. He authored the book *Good Idea Tilem in Modern Sculpture*.

Prof. Dr. Desak Made Suarti Laksmi is a Professor of Vocal Music, recipient of the Adi Sewaka Nugraha award from the Governor of Bali and the Kerti Budaya award from the Regent of Badung. She previously received teaching assistantship from the Clare Boothe Luce (CBL) Program in Music, Theater, and Balinese Dance at the College of the Holy Cross, USA.

Prof. Dr. Hendra Santosa is a Professor of Performing Arts History. He served as Head of the Computer Center Unit from 2004-2008. His publications include *The Evolution of Balinese Gamelan: From Banjuran to Adi Merdangga* (2020); *Karawitan Terms in Early Ancient Javanese Literary Works* (2021); *Music Composition Jaya Baya in JES Gamelan Fusion* (2023); and *Creative Gamelan Works of I Nyoman Windha* (2024).

Prof. Dr. I Wayan Karja is a Professor in Fine Arts. He served as Dean of the Faculty of Visual Arts and Design from 2004-2008. He received the international Mr. Nakasone Award in Tokyo, Japan. Prof. Karja has held more than 25 solo exhibitions in Bali, Malang, Yogyakarta, Jakarta, Hong Kong, Japan, Australia,

Switzerland, Italy, Germany, Hungary, Poland, China, and the United States. His latest solo exhibitions were at CSIS Jakarta and The Jakarta Post.

Prof. Dr. Ni Ketut Dewi Yulianti is a Professor of Cultural Linguistics. She is actively involved in research and teaching across Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral programs. She won research and art creation competitions with the English-language dance drama titled, *The Finding of Sita* and *Daksa Curses Lord Siva*.

Dr. Anak Agung Gede Rai Remawa is a lecturer and researcher specializing in Spatial Aesthetics. He has been an expert staff member for Cultural Heritage of Bali Province since 2020. He received the Adi Sewaka Nugraha award from the Governor of Bali in 2023, Dr. Ir. I Wayan Koster, M.M. He is the Principal Interior Designer for the Pura Wahyabya Bhuwana architecture and Traditional Balinese residential architecture at Dolina Charlotty, Poland. He has served as Vice Rector for Academic Affairs, Student Affairs, and Alumni (2021–2025).

Dr. A.A. Ngurah Anom Mayun K.T. is a lecturer specializing in traditional and modern Balinese bridal costume and makeup design. His monumental costume designs include performances such as *Nuwur Kakuwung Ranu*, *Ulu Batur Pasuwakan*, *Cupak Gerantang Anglanglang Bhuwana*, *Candet Ding Pitu Ning Pitu*, *Nayaka Bali Nagata*, and *Candet Ding Padmaswari Kalpa*. His fashion work was showcased at the Indonesian Embassy Fashion Show in Tokyo, Japan, in 2023.

Dr. I Wayan Suardana is a lecturer specializing in wood-based craft arts. He serves as Chair of the Institute for Research, Community Service, and Educational Development (LP2MPP) for the 2023-2025 period. Under his leadership, LP2MPP implemented the Bali Citta Swabudaya community service program. His work has been exhibited at the Bali Kanda Rupa event during the Bali Arts Festival.

Dr. I Gusti Putu Sudarta is a lecturer specializing in vocal music and choreography for contemporary music performances. He has engaged in international collaborations, most recently with composer Andy McGrow at the University of Richmond, USA. He serves as Coordinator of the Theater Study Program at ISI BALI.

Dr. I Ketut Garwa specializes in Balinese gamelan composition. He holds leadership roles as Vice Rector for Planning and Cooperation 2017-2021 and Dean of the Faculty of Performing Arts at ISI Denpasar 2013-2017 and 2021-2025. As a composer, he has created music for dance accompaniments such as: *Maskot*

Undiksha, Maskot Desa Penglipuran, Tari Kebesaran Undiknas, Maskot Kota Bangli, and Rejang Nata Hita.

Dr. I Ketut Kodi is a lecturer specializing in puppetry (pedalangan) and Pajegan masks. As a dalang (puppet master) in dance theater, he is widely respected for his vocal skills and mastery of gamelan literature. He has collaborated with the Sekar Jaya arts group in the United States.

Dr. I Kt. Suteja specializes in dance drama, particularly wayang wong (traditional dance drama). He served as Coordinator of the Doctoral Arts Program and Quality Assurance Center at ISI BALI from 2021-2025. He received the Kerti Budaya Arts Award from the Mayor of Denpasar and the Adi Sewaka Nugraha Award in 2023 from the Governor of Bali, Dr. Ir. I Wayan Koster, M.M. He was the Artistic Director for the dance drama *Jagra Budaya Bali Dwipa* (2024).

Dr. I Made Pande Artadi specializes in interior design. He holds leadership as Vice Dean for Student Affairs at the Faculty of Fine Arts and Design, ISI BALI. He created the Bali Mini pre-design work at Stupsk, Gdansk, Poland.

Drs. I Made Suparta, M.Hum is a lecturer specializing in wood-based crafts. He serves as Head of the UPT Documentation Center at ISI BALI. His crafted artworks have been exhibited at the *Bali Kanda Rupa* event during the Bali Arts Festival. In 2024, Suparta, along with I Made Sumantra, was specially invited by the Indonesian Embassy in Athens, Greece to create a monumental sculpture themed *Rama Sintha*.

Dr. I Nyoman Suardina is a product design specialist and currently serves as Coordinator of the Master's Program in Design at ISI BALI. His works include *Moenik*, *Selalu Ada Mimpi* (*There Is Always a Dream*), *Pencipta Energi Vorteks* (*Creator of Vortex Energy*), and *Energi Vorteks Imaji Kegersangan* (*Vortex Energy of Arid Imagination*). He is also a speaker in the *Craft and Wooden Typography Workshop*.

Dr. I Wayan Setem is a fine arts lecturer and Coordinator of the Master's Program in Arts Management at ISI BALI from 2024-2028. His works often utilize plastic waste as a medium to create three-dimensional artworks that reflect environmental preservation. He is also active in curatorial writing and is a member of the *Galang Kangin* arts community.

Dr. I Wayan Sujana specializes in contemporary installation art and serves as Coordinator of the Fine Arts Study Program at ISI BALI. He has participated in numerous national and international exhibitions and held solo exhibitions. In 2024, his participation included the piece, *Iustitia, at the International Virtual Exhibition, Sketch & Drawing*; the piece, *Rumah Altar (Altar House)* at the *Indonesia Bertutur* in Bali; and the piece, *Important Moment at* the *Bali-Global Art Map Exhibition* at ARMA, Tony Raka Gallery, and Komaneka Bali.

Dr. Ida Ayu Gede Artayani is a lecturer specializing in ceramic arts who also creates works in tapestry and batik. Her tapestry artwork titled *Moon in The Dark* passed curatorial selection and became part of the Shanghai Art Museum collection in 2023. She remains active in creating art and participating in local and national exhibitions.

Dr. Tjok Istri Ratna C.S. is a lecturer specializing in traditional Balinese textile (wastra) design and currently serves as Coordinator of the Fashion Design Study Program at ISI BALI. He also exhibited at the Ministry of Research and Technology in Jakarta, the Shanghai Art Museum (China) in 2023, at Universitas Sebelas Maret, Solo, and at B-GAAD in 2024. One of his mysticism-themed paintings is part of the Rudana Museum collection.

Drs. I Wayan Gulendra, M.Sn is a fine arts lecturer who has held leadership roles such as Head of the Fine Arts Study Program; Vice Rector for Student Affairs and Alumni (2013–2017); and Chair of the Academic Senate (2017–2021). He actively creates and exhibits artworks, notably at the Bali Arts Festival; in joint exhibitions at the ARMA Museum with ISI Bali lecturers; and has been a speaker on the *Dulang Reconstruction in Bangli* and on the painting works of Le Mayeur.

Drs. Tjokorda Abinanda Sukawati, M.Sn is a lecturer specializing in fashion design, particularly known for integrating *kain poleng* (Balinese sacred checkered cloth) with other traditional Balinese textiles in his creations. His international achievements include participation in: *The Glory of Balinese Art and Culture*, London (2017); *The Wastra Indonesia: Gianyar Woven Fabrics* at The Hague, Netherlands (2017); the Fashion Show at the Dubai World Expo (2021); the Fashion Show at the Ministry of Cooperatives and Small Medium Enterprises during the G20, in Nusa Dua (2022); and the International Conference of G20 (2023).

I Gede Oka Surya Negara, M.Sn, is a lecturer specializing in choreography who created numerous individual, group, and large-scale dance works. His notable piece *Cupak Gerantang* was a collaborative performance between ISI Denpasar and Dollina Charlotty Stupsk, Gdansk, Poland. Other works include *Kembang Rijasa*, *Arjuna Tapa*, *Sindhu Sadhu Astu*, *Baris*, and *Rejang Ulu Ranu*. Surya Negara has also served as a judge at local and national level dance competitions, including Bali Arts Festival events and the 2024 National Student Art Competition (FLS2N).

I Komang Darmayuda, M.Si, is a lecturer and composer in the Music Department, Faculty of Performing Arts, ISI BALI. He has served as the Coordinator of the Performing Arts Platform (Ajang Gelar). Ida Bagus Candra Yana, M.Sn, is a photography lecturer known for developing sustainable photography techniques, including printing on natural materials like leaves and stones. His publications include: *Nara Bhuwana Charma: Human Expression Around the World*; *Creative Filter Usage in Nature Photography*. With *Komunitas Bumi Bajra*, she collaborated with Performing Lines and Fourcolours to create choreography for the film *Seen and Unseen* (*Sekala Niskala*) directed by Kamila Andini, and also for the stage production *The Seen and Unseen*, involving artists from Japan, Australia, and Indonesia. I Wayan Sudirana, Ph.D, is a lecturer, researcher, and composer in neo-classical music. 




25. DIGITAL ARTS MANAGEMENT

- **A.** *Nata Kerthi* is an Integrated Performance Management Information System. Nata Kerthi is a digital-based *Single Sign-On* (SSO) management system at **ISI BALI**, designed to unify institutional performance management. Launched in **2021**, it comprises five integrated platforms:
- 1. Nata Citta, an integrated academic information system managing all academic data including: course and curriculum management; class scheduling and attendance; student registration; Study Plan Cards (KRS), grading, Study Result Cards (KHS), and transcripts; and integrated calculation of Excess Teaching Hours (KJM). This system is synchronized with the national higher education database (PDDikti).
- **2.** *Nata Mahardika*, a system for **Integrated new student admissions**, covering: registration for **SNBP** (Achievement-Based National Selection); registration for **SNBT** (Test-Based National Selection); and independent pathway admissions; and International student admissions
- **3.** *Nata Wretta*, a **financial management system** integrated with multiple platforms, including **bank payment gateways**.
- **4.** *Nata Diatmika*, a **graduation management system** specifically used for organizing ISI BALI's graduation ceremonies.
- **5. Questionnaire System**, designed to fulfil the need for accurate and evenly distributed **feedback from academic staff, students, and alumni**, through structured questionnaire collection and analysis.
- B. E-Library ISI Bali: Mobile-Based Digital Library Platform.

E-Library ISI Bali is a mobile-accessible digital library platform that offers unlimited access—anytime and anywhere—to the digital book collections of the ISI BALI Library. This application enhances academic engagement by providing seamless and flexible access to scholarly resources, supporting the learning and research needs of students, lecturers, and the wider academic community.


26. A Harmonious Gathering 'Kalangan Widya Mahardika'

A. FKI+ XII year 2023

KI+ XII 2023 is dedicated as a prestigious biennale art and design event involving art universities across Indonesia. This event also features collaborations between maestros, artists, designers, and professional art practitioners who contribute to the creation of innovative and thought-provoking works. **FKI+ XII 2023** also specifically invites renowned international art institutions, where the "+" signifies the expansion of networks and international participation.

FKI+ XII was held from October 24–27, 2023, at ISI Bali, featuring the following flagship activities: (1) Kalang Kalangon Kawikon – Global Performing Arts Showcase; (2) Rong Rupa Rakta – Visual Arts and Design Exhibition; (3) Parama Patra Pawimba – National Competition; (4) Dharma Waskita Dwipantara – International Seminar; (5) Lampah Laku Lelangit – Maestro's Workshop; (6) Sastra Desa Mawacara – Cultural Exploration Trip; (7) Pasamuan Maestro Nusantara – Maestro's Focus Group Discussion; and (8) Bali-Bhuwana Adhikarya – Global-Bali Job Fair and Expo.

FKI+ XII 2023 was attended by the following Indonesian higher education institutions in the arts: Indonesian Institute of Cultural Arts Aceh; Indonesian Institute of the Arts Padangpanjang; Indonesian Institute of Cultural Arts Bandung; Jakarta Institute of the Arts; Indonesian Institute of the Arts Surakarta; Indonesian Institute of the Arts Yogyakarta; Wilwatikta College of Arts Surabaya; Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar; and Indonesian Institute of Cultural Arts Tanah Papua. International university delegates included: Phetchaburi Rajabhat University, Thailand; National Academy of Arts, Culture, and Heritage (ASWARA), Malaysia; Okinawa Prefectural University of Arts, Japan; University of Western Australia; Bydgoszcz University of Science and Technology, Poland; Nanyang Academy of Fine Arts (NAFA), Singapore; and National University of Singapore. q







B. Kalangan Widya Mahardika

alangan Widya Mahardika, or the **Student Arts Week**, is a platform for practice and the actualization of learning, deeply rooted in Bali's sacred traditions and culture. This cultural foundation carries forward classical and traditional arts that are closely linked to ritual practices. Kalangan Widya Mahardika is held in conjunction with the celebration of Bali's sacred rites, aligning the academic calendar with cultural events.

Kalangan Widya Mahardika I (2022) was organized by students from the Performing Arts and the Visual Arts and Design programs from **September 27 to October 4, 2022.** Kalangan Widya Mahardika II (2023) was held from **November 22 to 28, 2023**, by students from the same programs, under the theme *Samudra-Rakta-Widya*, at ISI BALI (then known as ISI Denpasar).

The Faculty of Visual Arts and Design hosted a visual art and design exhibition at the Nata-Citta Art Space (N-CAS), ISI BALI. This exhibition showcased collaborative works between fine art and design students and included the art discussion forum Anglanglang Widya Waskita. Meanwhile, performing arts students presented traditional performances such as wayang kulit, arja, drama gong, wayang wong, and a unique reinterpretation of Cupak Grantang Semaya.

Kalangan Widya Mahardika III was held from December 20-22, 2024. During this event, in addition to the performance of *Candet Ding Padmaswari Kalpa*, several prestigious awards were presented: *Sewaka Kerthi Mahawidya Nugraha*; *Adhyapaka Nata Kerthi Nugraha*; and *Sewaka Mahabhakti Nugraha*. A special highlight of this edition was the ISI Bali Expo 2024, featuring 22 booths representing: 16 undergraduate/applied undergraduate and postgraduate study programs; 5 vocational high schools (*SMKN1 Sukawati, SMKN2 Sukawati, SMKN3 Sukawati, SMKN1 Denpasar, and SMKN5 Denpasar*); and LP2MPP ISI Denpasar. Each booth showcased innovative products in the fields of art, design, and culture, including organic bags, screen-printed T-shirts, traditional textiles (wastra), product designs, ceramics, and other creative items crafted by students, pupils, and professionals.

Kalangan Widya Mahardika IV (2025) carries the theme *Chadu-Gumi-Caksu*. As part of the celebration, ISI BALI students will present a **Traditional Arts Performance and Concert** titled *Cupak-Gerantang Jagat Caksu* at the **Wantilan Loka Widya Sabha**, ISI BALI, on **Sunday, January 19, 2025.** This event coincides with the *Panyineban Piodalan* (**Temple Ceremony**) at **Pura Padma Nareswara**, ISI BALI.



27. REPUTATION OF KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS AWARDS

SI BALI's Achievement in Key Performance Indicators (KPI) Recognition Award. ISI BALI achieved outstanding success in 2022 by winning in five categories of Key Performance Indicators (KPI): (1) Best KPI Growth among State Universities with Satker (PTN-Satker) status; (2) Top 10% position in the PTN-Satker Arts League; (3) Award in KPI 2 for the highest percentage of student participation in off-campus learning experiences; (5) Award in KPI 5 for faculty work recognized by the public or internationally acknowledged; (6) Award in KPI 6 for study programs collaborating with world-class partners. Additionally, ISI BALI received the Merdeka Belajar Award in the Academic Higher Education Institution Category for achieving the highest percentage of student participation in the Off-Campus MBKM Program, awarded on May 29, 2023, by the Minister of Education, Culture, Research, and Technology, Nadiem Anwar Makarim, during the Merdeka Belajar Month celebration.

In 2023, ISI BALI once again demonstrated excellence in KPI achievements: (1) Maintained **Top 10% position** in the PTN-Satker Arts League; (2) **Award in KPI 1** for graduates who are employed, self-employed, or continue their studies; (3) **Award in KPI 3** for faculty participation in off-campus activities; (4) **Award in KPI 5** for faculty work used by society or recognized internationally; (5) **Award in KPI 6** for study programs collaborating with world-class partners.



28. MAHASISYA NATA KERTHI NUGRAHA STUDENT AWARD

he Nata Kerthi Nugraha Student Award is given to individual students or student groups at ISI BALI who have demonstrated outstanding contributions, dedication, and achievements in advancing arts and culture, science, technology, community service, or humanitarian efforts. This award aims to recognize students who excel not only academically but also make a tangible impact on society and the world through their meaningful works. There are four categories for this award: Competition winners; Grant/competition recipients; Participants in festivals, parades, or exhibitions; and Scientific publications. Each award carries a credit weight (SKS) as follows: First and second place at the international level carries 3 and 2 SKS, respectively, and First place at the national level carries 2 SKS.

In **2024**, the Nata Kerthi Nugraha Award was given to **35** outstanding students at the national and international levels. The awards were presented by the Rector of ISI Denpasar, Prof. Dr. I Wayan Adnyana, after the Flag Ceremony commemorating National Education Day on **Thursday, May 2, 2024**, at the Lata Mahosadhi Building courtyard, ISI BALI. Notable achievements include: Clarissa Jessy Setiawan, a Music major who won the **Platinum Prize** in the Universal Music Competition held by Universal Stars

37. MASTERPIECE COSTUMES FOR PERFORMANCES

A. Costumes for Candet Ding Tantri Waruna

Candet Ding Tantri Waruna portrays the maritime civilization of the Indonesian archipelago, along with its rich traditions and myths. This performance featured ten dancers representing marine life. Eight principal dancers symbolizing various fish and pearl shells. One dancer portrayed a fisherman. The ten marine creatures depicted include: giant clam, sea urchin, coral reef, starfish, clownfish, thorny seahorse, anemone, flamboyant cuttlefish, seaweed, and blue-tentacled jellyfish. Meanwhile, the eight principal dancers represented: pearl oyster, gentle shark, aggressive shark, manta ray, flying fish, spotted whale fish, dolphin, and Napoleon fish.


The ten marine life costumes closely resembled the actual forms of the marine organisms they depicted. These costumes are crafted from various types of textiles, incorporating unique fabrication techniques. The eight principal costumes combined tailoring methods with textile design techniques such as tucking, smocking, and patchwork.

B. Padmaswari Kalpa Costumes

The Padmaswari attire is inspired by the beauty and grace of heavenly nymphs. This concept is expressed through elaborate headpieces, which included: pusung tekuk, petitis, kelat karna, subeng, garuda mungkur, melati tiba dada, melati keket, melati sirkam, and kembang goyang. The arms are adorned with bracelets, breast piece (badong), and a traditional belt buckle (pending). The fabric elements consist of: cinde, prada cloth, angkin bludru, sampur, and buntal. One celestial maiden attains divine perfection, transforming into the figure of Saraswati. The Saraswati costume included traditional elements, namely: gelung candi kusuma, subang, gelang kana, gelang tangan, badong, sesimping, ampok-ampok, wastra mekancut, oncer, and angkin.

C. Costumes and Charisma of Gempita Jagat Gelatik

Gempita Jagat Gelatik blended elegance and dynamism, drawing inspiration from the Gelatik bird, which symbolizes life that must blossom and flourish with fragrance. Born as a small, dull creature, this





Balinese endemic bird matures into a radiant being, captivating both the eye and the soul.

The wing patterns and motifs of the Gelatik bird, such as the fine lines on its chest and wings, inspired costume designs that featured dynamic and engaging textures. The bird's layered coloration—blending black, gray, and white—was interpreted through tiered cuts and draping techniques, adding depth and dimension to the overall appearance. The concept of beauty reflects the freedom and fluid movement of the Gelatik bird as it soars within flocks, resulting in costumes that are comfortable and allow for a wide range of motion. Just as the Gelatik bird adapts to its environment, these costumes embodied transformation in form, function, and style. Finally, lightweight and breathable materials such as cotton or linen conveyed softness and comfort, evoking the bird's natural habitat in open forests and mangroves.

Gempita Jagat Gelatik was an intermedia performance—a synthesis of dance, fashion dance, animated visuals, the Semaradana Damuh Tuwuh gamelan, orchestra, and lighting design, all interwoven in an annotated composition that depicted the graceful form of the Gelatik bird within a universe of metaphors.

The Tik Gelatik dance, part of the Gempita Jagat Gelatik performance, explored the stylistic flapping and nimble movements of the Pipit genus. Derived from the radiance of the Gelatik, this dance expressed the shimmering embodiment of this small bird through costume design. The stage space was enhanced with imaginative animated digital visuals. The Tari Tik Gelatik costume consisted of: gelung gelatik (Gelatik-style hairpiece), subang (ear ornaments), badong (chest collar), gelang kana and gelang tangan (bracelets), ampok-ampok (hip adornments), stewel (leg covers), lycra long pants, lycra long-sleeved top, feathered garment, cloth wraps, kancut (loincloth), awir (flowing scarf), tailpiece, and chest covering.

D. Costume and Character of the Paras Bumi Pamor Performance

Paras refers to padas stone (a type of solid rock), and also signifies a firm character. Pamor means a renowned name that is pure and white. Jagat means a grand realm that honors a famous name with a steadfast nature. The Paras Jagat Pamor performance consisted of three dances: (1) Bumi Bianglala Dance; (2) Bumi Tangi Dance; (3) Paras Pamor Dance

- 1. Bumi Bianglala Dance is one of the dance presentations in the intermedia performance, narrating the theme of color within the Paras-Jagat-Pamor segment titled Paraga. Rooted in the concept of the presence and absence of color in the rainbow of signs, the costumes in this dance are inspired by the distinct colors of the rainbow—an optical illusion caused by the refraction of light through a natural phenomenon—producing red, orange, yellow, green, blue, indigo, and violet stretching across the grey-blue sky. Five male dancers represented these rainbow colors, each symbolizing a natural sign as a reflection of refracted light. The costumes for the Bumi Bianglala Dance were designed to highlight the dancers' body contours, adopting a futuristic and solid look that aligned with the synthesized musical accompaniment. Dominated by holographic textiles and mirror materials, the costumes created dazzling optical illusions on stage through their light reflections.
- **2. Bumi Tangi Dance** was the climactic dance piece in the Paras-Jagat-Pamor intermedia performance, performed by seven male dancers accompanied by gong gede music with orchestral accents. The captivating color of tangi resembles a graceful purple—formed from a blend of red, symbolizing emotional intensity, and blue, representing calmness. Tangi, derived from the Balinese language, also means "to rise" or "to awaken," symbolizing optimism in life. As a secondary color in the color wheel, the costume design for Bumi Tangi Dance explores a wide range of purple shades, resulting in a mesmerizing visual harmony of tangi hues. Visually, the costumes draw inspiration from the Chinese-Indonesian heritage of Wayang Potehi, regarded as a foundational form from which various Indonesian shadow puppetry traditions have evolved. The silhouette resembles the Hanfu style—large, flowing robes made of layered textiles with diverse textures that draped and swept across the stage. The back of the costume featured five tangi flags, while a matching crown adorned the dancers' heads.

3. In the Paras Pamor Dance, Paras refers to padas stone and also symbolizes a steadfast character. Meanwhile, pamor means a renowned name that is pure and sacred. The Paras Pamor Dance served as the closing piece of the Paras-Jagat-Pamor performance, performed by eleven female dancers for a duration of three minutes. As a representation of purity and steadfastness, the costume design for this dance was dominated by white textiles, featuring a variety of fabric types ranging from coarse to smooth textures, and from light to heavy materials. Echoing the rhythm of crashing waves, pleated textile techniques with repetitive folds adorned much of the costumes. A three-meter-long sash draped from the right waist not only enhanced the costume's elegance but also served as a medium for the dancers to explore meditative space—gradually transitioning into a realm of serene silence, accompanied by meditative fusion music.



38. INNOVATION IN PERFORMANCE PROPERTIES

A. Ulam Ageng

The performance property known as Ulam Ageng (giant fish) was designed to interpret the theme of the Bali-Bhuwana Bhakti performance, Manu-Maha-Ulam. This performance was staged as part of the opening series of Bali Padma Bhuwana III and the 20th Dies Natalis, on Friday (Sukra Kliwon Sungsang), July 28, 2023. In form, the giant fish is represented with a large head, approximately 180 cm in diameter, with bulging eyes, a gaping mouth, and a snarl revealing sharp fangs. The body, scales, fins, and tail were constructed in separate segments. The scales are divided into 12 segments, the fins into 10 segments, and there is one segments forming the tail. The color scheme of Ulam Ageng evokes the appearance of deep-sea fish, with gradations of maroon, burgundy, and purple. In total, the piece weighed around 400 kg.

The Ulam Ageng is operated by 24 dancers. A visual spectacle unfolded as the dancers manipulated the fish in a serpentine manner, occasionally evoking predatory gestures. The performance offers a vivid portrayal reminiscent of the perilous life in the deep sea. Despite its gigantic size, the Ulam Ageng remained comfortably maneuverable for the dancers. In addition to the opening of Bali Padma Bhuwana III, this property was also featured in the Samudra Rakta Samasta performance during FKI + XII.

B. Lelakut of the Ulu Pasuwakan Arts

The performance piece in the form of a lelakut (ritual scarecrow or effigy) adorned with various secondary crops (sarwa tumuwuh) was specially designed for the large scale ecological performance titled Batur-Ulu-Pasuwakan. This event was held as part of the Bali Widya Kahuripan program (then known as Widya Bhakti Kahuripan) at Segara Danu Batur Temple, Kintamani, Bangli, on Tuesday (Anggara Umanis Uye), October 17, 2023.

This monumental performance piece explored the theme of honoring nature, embodying the values of Bali Widya Kahuripan, which coincided with the sacred Danu Kerthi ceremony—a ritual to venerate the lake. Lake Batur, held within the ancient caldera of Mount Batur, is a sacred and enduring body of water. Its waters flow through volcanic rock fissures and eventually feed 11 rivers across Bali. The subak irrigation system (pasuwakan) developed along these pristine river paths. Known as Pasihan Batur,

this agrarian culture offers the bounty of the earth as tribute to Lake Batur. The Lelakut Batur-Hulu-Pasuwakan interpreted this ritual of agricultural offering as a performance piece, visualizing the sacred connection between the land, water, and cultural reverence through artistic expression.

C. Mina Ageng: Carrier of Gambyuh Agung

The Mina Ageng piece was created by transforming a truck into a giant fish structure approximately 12 meters in length. The fish's head blended features of both a dragon and a majestic fish (specifically, a shark). Uniquely, the entire Mina Ageng structure was made from eco-friendly materials: the head and body were woven from intricately braided bamboo vines, and finer body details were achieved through color-graded cotton thread collages.


Mina Ageng served as a mobile stage for various percussion and wind instruments. From atop the structure, dozens of gamelan musicians performed, including players of mandolin, flutes, and gongs. This piece supported the performance of Gambyuh Agung, a grand parade presentation by ISI BALI (then named ISI Denpasar), during the opening of the Bali Arts Festival (PKB) XLIV on Sunday, June 12, 2022. The Gambyuh Agung gamelan ensemble is known as Asta Suara Bisah—"eight connected sound echoes," where the "h" in bisah symbolizes a sound that penetrates space. This ensemble consists of eight primary instruments: mandolin, kapuakan, okokan, bumbung gebyog, kendang krumpungan, pencon instruments, various flutes (including suling gambuh, suling titir, and suling pegongan), and colotomic instruments.

D. The Anchor of The Cadik Boat

To speak of the large scale stage performance Waruna-Rakta-Samasta, part of the opening of the Indonesian Arts Festival+ XII, on Wednesday (Buda Wage Menail), October 25, 2023, is to highlight the striking traditional Cadik Boat—a bold and commanding visual centerpiece.

This stage piece functioned not only as a visual icon, but also as a symbol of artistic success in interpreting the festival's theme: the veneration of coastal, marine, and oceanic realms. The Nusantara Cadik Boat adapts its form from ancient boat reliefs on the Borobudur Temple.

The stage piece, which also served as the altar for the performance's climax, was constructed with complex techniques combining bamboo and wood. Visually, it was gigantic and highly impressive, especially when illuminated with colorful stage lighting. More than just a visual element, the Cadik Boat became a vital artistic device, contributing to an explorative and immersive stage design.





39. BRANDING

A. Bali Sangga Dwipantara Logotype



The Bali Sangga Dwipantara logotype adopts a red design, symbolizing passion, energy, and boldness in elevating the arts and culture of the archipelago. The distinctive feature of this font lies in the letters "S" and "G," both designed with sharp lines pointing toward the sky. The letter "S" resembles a five-pointed wing, symbolizing the noble values of Pancasila as the foundation of Indonesia's unity. The word Sangga is constructed from a mirrored pair of the letter "G," which symbolically represents two swans—an emblem of purity. This font powerfully expresses the vision of Bali Sangga Dwipantara as a national festival that affirms the noble essence of Nusantara's art and culture.

B. Bali Padma Bhuwana Logotype

Bali Pad Ma Bhuwana

The Bali Padma Bhuwana logotype conveys a visual code centered on the lotus (padma) as a metaphor for the vast universe. The designer's keen eye is evident in the transformation of the letter "M" in Padma into the crown of a lotus flower—a clever and poetic gesture that encapsulates the meaning of Bali Padma Bhuwana as a platform for advancing world-class arts and culture. The choice of red reflects a burning spirit to position ISI BALI as a hub of excellence in artistic and design innovation.

C. Logotype Bali Nata Bhuwana

Bali Nata BhuMana

The Bali Nata Bhuwana logotype is a visual manifestation of scholarly spirit and boundless creativity. The font's composition is built upon the interconnection between letters, with a circular line encircling the letter "W" to represent connectivity, continuity, and expansion. This font aligns with the vision of Bali Nata Bhuwana as a platform for the actualization of learning outcomes into national and global arenas.

D. G-BACCH Logo



The logo of the Global-Bali Arts and Creativity Centre Hub (G-BACCH) visualizes ISI BALI's grand vision as a global hub for artistic and design creativity. It represents a spirit of openness, intercultural dialogue, and boundless creative exploration. The core form of the logo is rooted in the letter "G," shaped from the silhouette of a globe—a symbol of a dynamic world fostering connectivity and limitless horizons. This logo portrays Bali as a nexus of ideas, creative practices, and spaces of recognition.

E. B-GAAD Logo



The B-GAAD logo is designed with visual elements that reflect connectivity, dynamism, and global reach. The logo composition features a globe symbol with the Asia-Pacific map positioned behind the letters "AA," emphasizing B-GAAD as a central hub for the convergence of ideas and innovations in art and design that transcend geographic boundaries. The letters "AA" are shaped as a metaphor for blazing volcanoes, symbolizing the spirit of Asia-Pacific solidarity—ideally founded on the principles of disaster mitigation, social welfare, environmental conservation, and the sustainable preservation of local wisdom.

F. ISI BALI Logo

ISI BALI has the emblem Nretya Siwa Nataraja, consisting of the following symbols:

- · Lord Siwa with four arms;
- · Bedawang Nala (the mythological cosmic turtle from Balinese Hindu tradition);
- · Lotus leaves and flowers;
- · Balinese script reading: Meraya Citta Samasta;
- · and a Latin inscription reading: Institut Seni Indonesia Bali.

All the symbols are gold in color, arranged within a vertically elliptical maroon-colored mandala.

The Meanings of the symbols in the ISI BALI emblem:

- a. Lord Siwa with four arms embodies the cosmic dance, symbolizing Meraya Citta Samasta Agung through the veneration of art, design, and culture. The four arms of Lord Siwa hold:
 - 1) Lontar manuscript representing the source of knowledge;
 - 2) Fly-whisk whip (cemeti camara) symbolizing the driving force of creativity;
 - 3) Vina (musical instrument) representing supreme beauty;
 - 4) Prayer beads (genitri) symbolizing eternity.
- b. Bedawang Nala symbolizes the axis of the earth.
- c. Lotus leaves and flowers represent purity.
- d. The Balinese script "Meraya Citta Samasta" signifies a vow to honor art, design, and culture.
- e. The Latin inscription "Institut Seni Indonesia Bali" signifies the glorification of ISI Bali's name.
- f. The vertically elliptical mandala symbolizes the universal realm (Samasta Raya).
- g. The maroon color represents nobility and virtue.
- h. The gold color represents majesty and grandeur.



40. GIGANTIC MURAL

SI BALI utilized mural art as a medium to express the concept of Merdeka Belajar (Freedom to Learn). A gigantic mural was painted on the eastern wall of the Citta Kelangen Building. This artwork, created by ISI BALI alumni and students, was part of the 2024 Alumni Arts Festival. Measuring 22 by 16 meters, the mural depicts a young girl reading a book. More than just a visual illustration, the image encodes the spirit of learning unbounded by physical space.

This striking mural that captures the attention of every visitor to ISI BALI, was completed in seven days, involving nine instructors and 140 students from the departments of graphic arts, fine arts, and interior design. The nine instructors, all alumni and mural artists, included I Komang Merta Sedana (Mang Gen), I Wayan Dwima Adinata (Dwyma Bim), and Lorenz Angelia Rieza Pangestuty. The massive visual composition contributes to shaping the visual identity of ISI BALI as a leading campus for art and design in Indonesia.



41. LARGE SCALE ARTISTIC CREATIONS

a. Nuwur Kakuwung Ranu

ISI BALI (formerly known as ISI Denpasar) in collaboration with the Puri Kauhan Ubud Foundation presented the ecological art performance Nuwur Kakuwung Ranu. This performance reflected the theme of the Saraswati Sewana II Literary Festival 2022, organized by the Puri Kauhan Ubud Foundation. Nuwur means "to ask" or "to welcome"—particularly in the sense of honoring the divine; kakuwung means "rainbow," and ranu means "lake."

Nuwur Kakuwung Ranu was conceived as an ecological performance, interpreting the natural landscape and sacred artifacts, with the Pura Segara Danau Batur temple as the stage for devotional worship. The entire performance unfolded as a ritual event. Not all scenes followed a strict script, allowing space for the embodiment of divine spirit within the dancers' bodies—creating a spiritual experience for each performing artist.

The choreography drew on the styles of Tari Sang Hyang, pagambuhan, babarisan, and rarejangan dances. The climax of the performance featured barong macan (tiger barong), babi hutan (wild boar), and banteng (bull) as symbolic metaphors representing guardians of nature and the lake.



b. Gambyuh Agung Composition

ISI BALI (then known as ISI Denpasar) specially presented Gambyuh Agung, a newly created barungan (ensemble) inspired by the reverence for the Gambuh tradition. This was featured during the Peed Aya (Parade) of the Bali Arts Festival (PKB) XLIV on Sunday, June 12, 2022. The performance showcased 88 gamelan instruments and involved 99 musicians and Rarejangan dancers.

This new Gambyuh Agung ensemble embodied the joyous tone of the gambuh flute harmonized with the vibrant sounds of the natural environment. It served as an expressive medium, inspired by the melis tradition—an important ritualistic activity in Balinese ceremonial rites (yadnya). The aesthetic inspiration came from the use of sampyan lis (a woven offering) in the melis ritual, particularly when sprinkling holy water. Based on this idea, the composer integrated the musical potential of the mandolin with the colorful soundscape of the rice field environment—creating an ecological sonic palette.

The ensemble combined the melodic diversity of asta swara bisah, comprising gambuh flute, bonang, genggong, kendang krumpung, bumbung gebyog, krepyak, mandolin, and okokan. Asta swara bisah refers to the "eight eternal sound echoes," representing the essence of cosmic sound. Bisah also relates to the phonetic articulation of the Balinese syllabary, particularly the gentle "h" intonation. Honoring Gambuh as a classical musical drama with global resonance, this new ensemble highlighted melodically flowing instruments with the gambuh flute as the guru swara (master sound).

Conceptually, the composition harmonized the natural texture and ambiguity of pagambuhan flute tones, while elaborating the rhythmic flow of bonang, kendang, okokan, krepyak, gebyog, mandolin, and genggong. It aligned with the philosophy of Danu Kerthi Huluning Amreta—honoring water as the source of life. This year's Gambyuh Agung work was titled Langlang Tembang Danu, which interpreted the melis tradition as a cosmic purification rite (Bhuwana Alit–Bhuwana Agung).



42. PADUDUSAN ALIT CEREMONY AT PADMA NARESWARA TEMPLE

series of sacred ceremonies—Malaspas, Ngenteg Linggih, Mupuk Pedagingan, Caru Manca Kelud, and Padudusan Alit—were held at Padma Nareswara Temple ISI BALI (then ISI Denpasar) from Tuesday (Anggara Umanis Wuku Wayang), September 27, 2022, through Saturday Kliwon Wuku Wayang, October 1, 2022. This sacred ceremony follows a 30-year cycle and aims to nurture and purify the spiritual power of the sacred site.

The sequence of ceremonies included Nyukat Genah Yadnya, Nanceb Tataring, Tawur Manca Kelud, Melasti, with the climax coinciding with Tumpek Wayang, followed by nganyarin, panyineban, and the sacred journey Nyegara Gunung. The holy water sanctification (mendak tirtha) ceremony was conducted at various temples, including the Kayangan Tiga of Desa Sumerta, Lempuyang Luhur Temple, Goa Lawah Temple, Andakasa Temple, Uluwatu Temple, Batukaru Temple, Puncak Mangu Temple, Ulun Danu Batur Temple, Besakih Temple, Pusering Jagat Temple, Kentel Gumi Temple, and Sakenan Temple. All funding for these sacred ceremonies was carried out independently through communal cooperation without any government budget.

43. RATU AYU MAS MEMBAH MASK AND PERFORMANCE

ince the Nuwur Kakuwung Ranu performance on Saturday (Saniscara Kliwon Wuku Uye), May 14, 2022, at the outer courtyard of Segara Danu Batur Temple, Kintamani, ISI BALI has honored the sacred Mapuspata mask of Ratu Ayu Mas Membah. This goddess mask, with a beautiful face, radiates sacred charm and serenity. The golden mask is adorned with a traditional crown with a konde hairstyle. The mask was sanctified (pasupati) at Pura Ulun Danu Batur by Jro Gede Batur Alitan and is now enshrined at Padma Nareswara Temple ISI BALI.

44. THE CHARISMA OF THE DESAIN HUB BUILDING

he *Desain Hub* building is a newly completed four-story structure, funded through the Government Sharia Securities (SBSN) Budget Year 2024. Covering a total area of 3,012 square meters, it features modern and comprehensive facilities designed to support the development of creativity and innovation in the field of design. The building houses animation design laboratories and studios, a multimedia room, a teleconference room named *Sabha Citta Mahottama*, and lecture halls. This building stands as an iconic laboratory—not only complete in terms of facilities and utilities but also visually impressive and charismatic in its architectural design. The façade of *Desain Hub* at ISI BALI is grand, with six tall, sturdy pillars symbolizing *Sad Kerthi* (the six paths of universal reverence). It is supported by 21 wide steps, each 15 meters across, making it a favorite spot for photography. The entire staircase can comfortably accommodate around 600 people posing simultaneously. Both front walls are adorned with carved sandstone reliefs depicting plant motifs, while the wooden frames of the main doors perfectly complement the building's beauty.













45. MAJESTIC LATA MAHOSADHI BUILDING

he *Lata Mahosadhi* building stands majestically on a 4,000-square-meter plot of land and was constructed in 1994. Its architecture reflects the distinctive character of Balinese culture. At the front of the building, a large *bajera* (bell-shaped canopy) serves as a symbol of the strength and sacredness of Balinese art. As a center for art documentation, *Lata Mahosadhi* houses an extensive collection of art objects, including various types of gamelan instruments, traditional dance costumes, masks, and paintings, making it unique among museums in Indonesia. Within the complex, there is also a sacred *pura taksu* (temple) and a small theater used for seminars, film screenings, video presentations, and dance demonstrations, making it an ideal place for education and the development of arts and culture in Indonesia. Careful maintenance has been undertaken, with a full roof renovation completed in 2022 and a major interior renovation completed in 2024.





46. THE REFINED CITTA KELANGEN BUILDING

he *Citta Kelangen* building is a vital and strategic facility owned by ISI BALI. Constructed in 2012, it covers an area of 4,300 square meters. The third floor named the *Kirtya Sabha Mahottama Auditorium*, features elegant interior design following renovations completed in 2023. The second floor contains seminar rooms and office spaces, while the first floor is dedicated to classes and lecture rooms for ISI BALI's postgraduate program.




Citta Kelangen is fully utilized for academic activities, performances, and meetings. This building stands as a symbol of ISI BALI's progress in academics and embodies the dynamic, collaborative, and inclusive campus atmosphere that fosters the advancement of the nation's arts and culture.





47. THE CHARMING NRETYA MANDALA STAGE

retya Mandala is a large open-air stage (amphitheater) notable for its size within a university setting. It has been popularized by Generation Z with the nickname "Dragon Ball Stage." Built in 1988, the amphitheater spans 1,382 square meters and has a seating capacity of 1,500 spectators.



Recent plans include the renovation of the *Gelung* (temple-like structure) to make it taller and larger, enhancing the charm of *Nretya Mandala*. The renovation will also add restroom facilities and expand seating for gamelan and orchestra performers. These improvements aim to deepen the appreciation experience by fostering a more intimate interaction between the artwork and the audience.



48. THE ELEGANT NATYA MANDALA BUILDING

he Natya Mandala building is one of the Panca Tatenger Widyalango (The Big Five Academic Buildings) at ISI BALI, alongside Latta Mahosadhi, Citta Kelangen, Desain Hub, and Candra Mettu. It features a prestigious proscenium stage highly coveted by Bali's top performing artists. Built in 1987, Natya Mandala covers an area of 1,387 square meters and accommodates up to 400 spectators.

The interior renovation carried out in 2023 introduced a grand *kori agung tri lawang* (three-door gate) adorned with intricate Balinese floral motifs. The auditorium's interior structure, walls, and ceiling were redesigned to create a modern theater niche, featuring a soaring ceiling, tiered seating, and highly soundproof acoustics. *Natya Mandala* stands as the first landmark building marking the advancement of ISI BALI, which was formerly known as ASTI Denpasar.






49. THE PRIZED NATA-CITTA ART SPACE

he *Nata-Citta Art Space* (N-CAS) is one of Bali's foremost visual art venues. Initially established in 1991 with a floor area of 1,000 square meters, N-CAS was designed as a center for the dissemination and actualization of high-quality visual art and design works.

In 2024, N-CAS underwent a major renovation, transforming its interior by integrating pillars into continuous display walls for artworks and design pieces. The lighting system was upgraded to meet the standards of world-class contemporary galleries. With its revitalized presence, N-CAS significantly enhances the vibrancy of Bali's contemporary visual art scene. Numerous visual arts events have been held in this art space, including an International Photography collaborative exhibition with the American Photography Society, Traditional Balinese Painting Exhibition, *Kanda Rupa*, and selected International Exhibitions by ISI BALI.





50. THE ILLUSTRIOUS CARMA WALL OF FAME

he *Carma Wall of Fame* at ISI BALI is a monumental facade made of black and red granite, designed to honor and commemorate the extraordinary contributions of maestros, cultural figures, and artists to the advancement of ISI BALI. Standing at 4.5 meters tall and stretching 14 meters in length, this impressive wall serves as one of ISI BALI's proud landmarks. Located at the *Widya Mahardika* ceremonial field, the Wall of Fame functions not only as a space of tribute but also as a symbol of reverence for those who have rendered outstanding service to the institution. On the western side of the Wall of Fame lies the *Dedication of Life* panel, engraved with the names and signatures of ISI BALI lecturers and education staff who have completed their service.



51. THE COZY FOOD COURT

asandekan Citta Mahardika (Food Court) at ISI BALI serves as a gathering place for the academic community, administrative staff, and members of the art and design public to enjoy traditional Indonesian snacks and cuisine. Designed with an elegant architectural concept, its roof takes the shape of a tumpeng—a symbolic cone-shaped rice dish—evoking gratitude for abundant blessings and a joyful spirit. Strategically located at the convergence point of five of ISI BALI's iconic buildings—Citta Kalangen, Desain Hub, Candra Metu, Latta Mahosadi, and the Rectorate Building—the Food Court occupies a central and vital position on campus. Completed in 2024, it spans a total area of 1,598 square meters and offers a comfortable and inviting atmosphere, nestled amidst lush greenery and a serene garden landscape.



52. THE TIMELESS GARDEN OF ISI BALI


tepping on to the campus of ISI BALI, one is greeted by lush, meticulously maintained gardens. Towering endemic Balinese trees stand proudly, adorned with delicate flowering vines and the graceful blooms of moon orchids. Their sturdy, timeworn trunks rise amidst the soft expanse of grass, offering a refreshing sight. The gentle hum of bees occasionally harmonizes with the fluttering wings of butterflies, guided by the crisp chirping of sparrows and the soothing coo of doves.

A rich tapestry of flora thrives, their green leaves shimmering with vitality, occasionally whispering through the rustling of branches and twigs. Every tree bears a name, each offering a story, a purpose, a gift. Let us ask the 653 trees that stand tall here: 8 Pule, 23 Golden Palms, 21 Ketapang, 53 Norfolk Pines, 1 Acacia, 1 Neem, 10 Green Palms, 35 Tanjung, 10 Kayu Santen, 17 Parasok, 23 Princess Palms, 1 Bengkel,



2 Mojopait, 17 Bottle Palms, 3 Sugar Palms, 1 Tayuman, 8 Fan Palms, 1 Banyan, 1 Suar, 8 Mangosteen, 13 Badung, 12 Soursop, 34 Betel Nuts, 3 Sandalwood, 4 Purna Jiwa, 7 Jackfruit, 3 Kepundung, 1 Mango, 10 Longan, 6 Starfruit, 2 Camplung, 16 Sawo Kecik, 5 Coconut, 17 Avocado, 2 Sentul, 3 Durian, 2 Gatep, 1 Matoa, 208 Frangipani, 15 Champak, 3 Pudak, 4 Majegau, 7 Rijase, and 31 Sandat. What promise does your existence hold for ISI BALI? As we drift into slumber, you remain awake, carrying the fragrance of time. Yet, should we reach even deeper and call out to every Croton, Likuanyu, Pucuk, Agave, Pungut, Simbar, Orchid, Paper Flower, Mitrea, Samblung, and Soga—each one testing the depths of longing?





53. THE IMPOSING TERRACOTTA SCULPTURE

he imposing *Terracotta Sculpture*, titled *Wana-Segara-Ampo*, is a monumental artwork resulting from the collaboration between lecturers and students, composed of 2,000 terracotta modules. This piece intricately and vividly portrays marine life, capturing the richness and complexity of underwater ecosystems. Built in 2022, the sculpture stands 9 meters tall and spans 6.2 meters in width. It presents the biodiversity of the ocean—from coral reefs to various marine species—interacting harmoniously within their natural habitat.

The creation of each terracotta module required firing at a temperature of 800 degrees Celsius, intended to produce an artwork that is not only beautiful and detailed but also strong and weather-resistant. This durability symbolizes the enduring power of nature and the awe-inspiring life beneath the sea. The sculpture draws inspiration from the famed Stonehenge monument in Salisbury Plain, United Kingdom. Much like Stonehenge, *Wana-Segara-Ampo* carries a symbolic message about the profound connection between humans and nature, and highlights the crucial role of marine life in maintaining the balance of global ecosystems.

54. THE SACRED SPACE OF CITTA SAMASTA

he vision of ISI BALI has been pursued with focus, dedication, and integrity. Since 2021, its direction has been guided with one goal: *ISI BALI Meraya Samasta*! The perspective and mindset of faculty members, students, and staff have been seamlessly integrated into every dialogue, discussion, academic forum, and reflective space. No barriers exist regardless of position, social status, setting, timing, urgency, or distance. The commitment to realizing this vision has never wavered. Instead, it continues to grow, flourish, and shine ever brighter.

Hulu Mula Phase: This phase focuses on shaping sustainable policies; strengthening higher education platforms in arts and design; establishing strategic avenues for learning outcomes and creative/research innovations; facilitating intellectual property rights; high-impact scholarly works; and research or creative competitions. Rooted in a passion for authenticity, the Hulu Mula Phase embraces novelty, challenges cliches, breaks through stagnation, and transcends conventional boundaries.

Alir Alur Phase: This phase focuses on organizing faculty members and staff resources based on capacity, capability, and reputation; strengthening unity, humility, and a spirit of dedication; prioritizing planning and budgeting for educational infrastructure including the procurement of design computers, musical instruments, gamelan, media recording equipment; as well as construction of the Design Hub Building, an integrated laboratory, various building renovations; and fostering social awareness (*welas asih*). The Alir Alur Phase is built upon a foundation of an unwavering commitment, strong resolve, and deep empathy–all in pursuit of a shared vision.


Hilir Luhur Phase: This phase focuses on the implementation and realization of sustainable policies including dissemination of learning outcomes, large-scale arts performances, and exhibitions showcasing outstanding artworks. It also emphasizes the actualization of both individual and institutional capacities as demonstrated by participation in prestigious events such as: World Expo Dubai 2021, Taman Bali Indah Charlotta Valley Design in Poland 2022-2024, Féte De L'Archipel 2023 in Paris, Art Moment Bali 2023, Bali Night Festival 2024 in Astana-Kazakhstan, Art Jakarta 2024, the creation of the monumental statue for the Indonesian Embassy in Athens-Greece 2024, Geidai Art Festival Okinawa-Japan 2024, Indonesian Cultural Nights 2024 in Thailand, The

13th ASEAN Arts and Culture Exposition with International Performing Festival 2024 Phetchaburi-Thailand, and The Bali Arts Festival 2022-2024. The Hilir Luhur Phase is the embodiment of words and aspirations transformed into reality.

Muara Meraya Phase: This phase celebrates the achievement of prestigious awards and global recognition, including the Key Performance Indication Award 2022-2023, the Merdeka Belajar Award, the Diktiristek Award 2022-2023, and the Diktisaintek Award 2024. It also fosters global solidarity through Bali-Global Axis of Arts and Design (B-GAAD) that strengthens international connections in the fields of Arts and Design. The Muara Meraya Phase rejects all empty promises, but instead honors creation and innovation as hallmarks of excellence.

Each phase is structured by integrated thinking, tested through moments of simulation and reflection, accelerated by simultaneous action, and driven by the endless possibilities of future excellence. Each program and event is framed by authentic themes, articulated through a cosmology of meaningful and essential language, and shaped by unified action.

This vision has been echoed in ISI BALI's programs. In 2022, the institution honored the sacredness of water through the *National Festival Bali Sangga Dwipantara II* with the theme "Hulu-Banyu-Nuswantara," and the *International Festival Bali Padma Bhuwana II* with the theme "Argha-Tirtha-Sidhi: Water Energy and Creative Prospect." In 2023, the focus shifted to the celebration of the ocean and maritime culture, with *FKI + XII* themed "Samudra-Raktha-Samastha: Bahari Daya Cipta Seni Kini," the *International Festival Bali Padma Bhuwana III* themed "Samudra-Samahita-Samasta: A Noble Vision of Maritime Civilization," and the *National Festival Bali Sangga Dwipantara III* themed "Wahya-Waruna-Wasantara: Glorifying the Archipelagic Seas for a Brilliant Indonesia." Then, in 2024, ISI BALI elevated the virtue of humanity through the *International Festival Bali Padma Bhuwana IV* with the theme "Manawa-Murti-Manu: The Awakening of Human Virtue," the *National Festival Bali Sangga Dwipantara IV* themed "Manawa-Mukti-Manu: Glorifying the Human Spirit of Indonesia," and *Bali Citta Samasta (Alumni Art Festival)* with the theme "Manawa-Prabawa-Manu: A Forum of Noble Generations."



55. THE FUTURE ROADMAP

he 20-year future roadmap of ISI BALI is established based on the realization of its vision: to be Character-Driven, Excellent, and Globally Reputable. The character-driven aspect is built upon five achievement indicators in academic implementation, namely: impact, meaning, innovation, enlightenment, and dignity. Excellence refers to the quality marked by five indicators of achievement: distinction, inspiration, reliable, exemplary, and a role model. Global reputation refers to core values reflected through five indicators of eminence: reputation, influence, courage, revelation, and liberation.

The vision of ISI BALI for the period of 2025–2045 is to become a higher education institution in the fields of arts, design, digital media, and culture that is character-driven, excellent, and globally reputable. To measure the achievement targets of each component of this vision, the following qualitative justifications are formulated:





A. Friday (Sukra Umanis Ukir), 28 February 2025

As an expression of gratitude for the enactment of Presidential Regulation of the Republic of Indonesia Number 14 of 2025 concerning the Change of Name from Institut Seni Indonesia Denpasar to Institut Seni Indonesia Bali on 12 February 2025 (State Gazette of the Republic of Indonesia Year 2025 Number 21), a ceremony was held, led by the Minister of Education, Science, and Technology of the Republic of Indonesia, Prof. Brian Yuliarto, PhD, represented by Vice Minister Prof. Dr. Fauzan M.Pd., and the Minister of Culture, Dr. Fadli Zon, S.S., M.Sc., along with the Rector of ISI BALI, Prof. Dr. I Wayan Adnyana.




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58. MANDALA ISI DENPASAR

he Indonesian Institute of the Arts Denpasar is an arts higher education institution administered by the Ministry of National Education and directly accountable to the Minister of National Education. ISI Denpasar is functionally supervised by the Directorate General of Higher Education, Ministry of National Education. ISI Denpasar was established under Presidential Decree of the Republic of Indonesia Number 33 of 2003, dated May 26, 2003, as the result of the integration between the Indonesian College of the Arts (Sekolah Tinggi Seni Indonesia – STSI) Denpasar and the Visual Arts and Design Program (PSSRD) of Udayana University. During the leadership of Prof. Dr. I Wayan Rai S., M.A., who served as Rector of ISI Denpasar from 2004 to 2013, several new programs were introduced, including the Master's Program in Artistic Creation and Studies (S2) in 2011; the Diploma IV Program in Fashion Design in 2012; and in 2013, the Diploma IV Program in Television and Film, the Bachelor's Program in Arts Education for Drama, Dance, and Music, and the Bachelor's Program in Music. Additionally, the Citta Kelangen and Citta Hasta Mandala buildings were established. Under the leadership of Prof. Dr. I Gede Arya Sugiartha, S.SKar., M.Hum, who served as Rector from 2013 to 2021, ISI Denpasar successfully introduced the Doctoral Program in Arts (S3) in 2017 and the Master's Program in Design (S2) in 2020, and completed the construction of a parking facility and the Reneng Studio Building.

During the tenure of Prof. Dr. I Wayan Adnyana, S.Sn., M.Sn., as Rector from 2021 to 2025, ISI Denpasar introduced the Master's Program in Arts Education (S2), the Bachelor's Program in Product Design (S1), and the Diploma IV Program in Animation in 2022; the Bachelor's Program in Theatre and the Master's Program in Arts Management (S2) in 2023; and the Doctoral Program in Design (S3) in 2024. Major infrastructure projects included the completion of the Design Hub and Integrated Laboratory buildings, the renovation of the roof and interior of the Latta Mahosadhi building, as well as the renovation of the Nata Citta Art Space and the Natya Mandala building.

59. KARANG STSI DENPASAR

Number 0445/0/1988, ASTI Denpasar was elevated to the status of the Indonesian College of the Arts (Sekolah Tinggi Seni Indonesia – STSI) Denpasar. The establishment of STSI Denpasar was formally confirmed through Presidential Decree Number 22 of 1992. During the leadership of Prof. Dr. I Made Bandem, M.A., who served as Chair of STSI from 1988 to 1997, the institution successfully introduced the Bachelor of Fine Arts program (S1) in 1996 and completed the construction of the Natya Mandala Building, Latta Mahosadhi, Nretya Mandala, and Niti Praja Mandala; under the leadership of Prof. Dr. I Wayan Dibia, SST., M.A., who served as Chair of STSI from 1997 to 2002, the Candra Metu Building was successfully constructed. During the tenure of Dr. I Wayan Rai S., M.A., who served as Chair of STSI from 2002 to 2003, the institution successfully added the Photography program (S1) in 2002.



60. NATAH ASTI BALI

he Indonesian Academy of Dance Arts (Akademi Seni Tari Indonesia – ASTI) Denpasar was established by the Regional Government of the Province of Bali on January 28, 1967, pursuant to the Decree of the Governor and Head of Region Level I Bali Number 2/Pem/5/I/a/1967, upon the initiative of the Cultural Advisory and Development Council (Majelis Pertimbangan dan Pembinaan Kebudayaan / Listibya). The establishment of ASTI Denpasar was based on the Fundamental Policy Framework for the Development of Balinese Regional Culture, which emphasized the preservation, exploration, cultivation, and advancement of Balinese cultural heritage. The increasing interaction between culture and technology, as well as the growing number of artists passing away, raised concerns about the potential extinction of several forms of traditional Balinese arts. Consequently, it became imperative to provide arts education for the younger generation as heirs and preservers of the nation's cultural heritage.



Two years after its founding, ASTI Denpasar was granted national status by the Ministry of Education and Culture through Decree Number 066/1969 dated August 7, 1969, and was designated as a department under ASTI Yogyakarta, with its administration overseen by the Directorate General of Culture, Ministry of Education and Culture. For eight years, ASTI Denpasar operated under the Directorate General of Culture. Due to changes in the organizational structure of the Ministry of Education and Culture, since 1976 its administration has been overseen by the Directorate General of Higher Education. The director of ASTI during the period of 1967 to 1981 was I Wayan Mertha Sutedja, B.A., followed by Dr. I Made Bandem from 1981 to 1988. During Dr. I Made Bandem's tenure, ASTI Denpasar became widely recognized by the Balinese community for its significant contributions in exploring, developing, and advancing Balinese arts and culture.

This higher education institution serves as a true center for *aguron-guron* (master-disciple learning), fostering the growth of outstanding generations of artist and cultural practitioners in Bali. I am very hopeful that at ISI BALI, all Balinese traditions, arts, culture, and local wisdom will be studied, disseminated, internationalized, and even initiated to create new arts and designs.

The publication of the book ISI BALI 60: Beauty, Depth, Nobility is one of the efforts to honor Balinese traditions, arts, culture, and local wisdom in all their innovative forms. The concept of Bali as envisioned by ISI BALI is realized through the platform *Astha Mahacitta Pabali* (Eight Missions for the Realization of ISI BALI's Noble Ideals), which is elegantly laid out in this book. The Padma Bhuwana building was established as a venue for the International Festival, which is closely aligned with Bali's development goals to realize Bali as the Center of World Civilization. As the Governor of Bali, I highly appreciate the publication of the book ISI BALI 60: Beauty, Depth, Nobility as a historic milestone marking the birth of ISI BALI. I believe this book, which reflects the passion and dedication of the ISI BALI academic community, will serve as important reading and a reference for the management of higher education in arts, design, and culture, which must always synergize with the Regional Government.

I call on the ISI BALI academic community to continue exploring the uniqueness, richness, and excellence of Balinese traditions, arts, culture, and local wisdom.
